In announcing the plenary indulgence, the Rev. Bob E. Morphy, diocesan director of Sodality originally scheduled for Sunday, May 23, has been postponed to the early fall when a huge Sodality two-day convention will be held in Rochester.

The Plenary Indulgence to be gained on Trinity Sunday was granted by His Holiness Pope Pius XII for seven years to mark World Sodality Day. Requirements are confession and reception of Holy Communion, renewal of act of consecration to the Blessed Virgin Mary and praying for the Pope's intention.
