WKNP Contest
Opened by K.C.
Unit in Corning

Corning — The "Where Am I" and "Fight Communism" contest inaugurated on Corning's FM radio station WKNP Friday evening and sponsored by Corning Council No. 281, Knights of Columbus, is attracting interest of area residents, council officers state. The first week the prize amounted to \$50.

The contest continues Friday at 9 p. m. Efforts are being made by local K. of C. members to enlist the support of area residents in the program which is designed to assist the council raise funds to carry on an expanded activities program and alleviate its building fund indebtedness. People are urged to write a letter of 50 words or less completing the following sentence: "I am opposed to Communism because . . ."

Under the K. of C. rules it is recommended that participants include 25 cents, 50 cents or \$1 for the three classifications of letters which a local K. of C. and citizens committee will judge weekly. From the three best letters submitted to the station the WKNP announcer conducting the Friday program will telephone the writers. The person identifying the community in the WKNP coverage area, which includes a 60-mile radius of Corning, will be declared the winner of the "Where Am I" contest and will receive the prizes arranged by the K. of C.
