

IMMEDIATE REACTION of labor men to the historic agree ment is that they have won an "ideological victory" They are happy not so much over the actual wage increase as they are over the fact that GM management has accepted a new philosophy of wages

For a long time labor men. particularly the CIO leaders. have been waving cost of living reports under the noses of their employers Their argument has been - "Give us more money because we NEED IT TO LIVE. We need it to buy coal and food and clothes"

CATHOLIC SOCIAL experts. too are optimistic about the new GMLCAW part because they see in it recognition of the Catholic doctrine of the living wage as taught by Pope Leo XIII and Prus XI

As expressed by these Pontiffs the prime consideration in determining the just and living wage is the needs of the worker and his family The wage paid to the workingman must be sufficient for the support of himself and his family Normally speaking a work-

er has only one way of obtaining the necessities of life for himself and his family and that is from his work 'Every effort must therefore he made states Plus XI that lathers of families receive a wage sufficient to meet adequately ordinary domestic needs."

If a worker is not receiving a wage sufficient for his meeds then there is something wrong. If a worker is not being paid a living wage then he is subsidizing the business and man agement is morally bound 'o make every effort to cortect this injustice
