 Ten new Knights of Peter Claver were initiated into the Bishop Bernard J. McQuaid Council of the Rochester Diocese May 28 at St. Joseph's House of Hospitality in formal ceremony marking the first activity of the new fraternal organization for Catholic Negro men.

Orlando J. Greene was chosen to head the interracial group as Grand Knight. Other officers selected were: Alfred Vallot, Deputy Grand Knight; Joseph H. PRECEDING THE initiation, 25 knights and candidates attended 8 o'clock Mass at Immaculate Conception Church and received Holy Communion in a body. The Rev. George S. Wood, chaplain of the new group, said the Mass and the Rev. John L. Obendorfer, C.S.S.R., chaplain of the Buffalo council, was in the sanctuary. The first three degrees of Claverism were exemplified by a degree team from Buffalo headed by Initiation Master Philip Blake. Also assisting were Northern District Organizer Luther C. Keith of Detroit, Ohio State Organizer Clarence Polindexter of Toledo and Brother C. F. Smith of Toledo. Included with the Rochester candidates were six new knights initiated for the Bishop O'Hara Council of Buffalo.

The Knights of Peter Claver are a fraternal and social organization founded in 1909 to promote charitable, educational and social activities for Catholic Negroes. Aiming at the ideal of the moral and spiritual improvement of all members and the promotion of Catholic education, the society welcomes as members Catholic men between 18 and 55. The Rochester Council is the second in New York State. Plans are being made to establish a Ladies' Auxiliary shortly.
