200-Ton Mark Passed in HNS Paper Drive

Second round in a drive for old newspapers and magazines being conducted by the Rochester Deanery Holy Name Union is scheduled to begin Saturday, June 5. No collections are slated this weekend because of the holiday period, it was announced.

With more than 200 tons gathered during the first round in more than 30 parishes of Monroe County, Holy Name officers have expressed themselves as highly gratified at the cooperative response to the campaign. Funds from the sale of the paper are to be used to provide services to the more than 100 parish Holy Name Societies in the diocese through the new Holy Name central office.

Among parish drives not thus far publicly reported were ones conducted recently in St. John the Evangelist parish, under Chairman Joseph Starks; St. Bridget's, Oliver C. Pasch; St. Salome's, Arthur Guenther, and St. Agne's, William Grief and Joseph Vaeth. Twelve county parishes also have participated.

Members of the Executive Committee of the Diocesan Holy Name Union are expected to meet soon to consider a series of off-ear training courses for all Holy Name officers in each diocesan deanery, with the purpose of having all societies ready for a complete program for fall meetings.

Blood Donations Urged As Catholic Unit Charity

Catholics of parochial and social organizations have a chance to practice group charity by giving their blood to the Rochester Red Cross Blood Center, Red Cross authorities announced this week in issuing a general invitation to Catholic groups to donate blood.

Citing the student body of St. Bernard's Seminary for sending 41 generous donors in two groups, directors of the Center, at 150 Spring Street stressed the crying need for more contributions.

Although there have been hundreds of individual Catholic donors, Red Cross leaders said, no other Catholic organization has acted as a group. "Because four Catholic hospitals in the Rochester diocese every day depend upon our Blood Center for free supplies of whole blood and plasma, Catholic organizations such as parish Holy Name groups, Catholic women's societies and school bodies may welcome a chance to assist in maintaining our supplies."

THE CENTER is open each Monday from noon to 6:30 p. m. and each Thursday from 1 to 5 p. m. Any group or individuals wishing to donate blood may make appointments by calling Main 6130. Any number of givers will be welcomed and authorities will gladly accommodate a regular number of donors from any Catholic group each week or each month.

Arthur P. Farren, executive secretary of the Diocesan Holy Name Society, announced today that this program will be stressed to all parish Holy Name groups by letters and personal solicitation.

Aliming at the collection of 25,000 pints of blood this year the Rochester Blood center was opened Jan. 12 as the first in a national network of 400 similar centers. The local center serves an 11 county area where there are 27 hospitals to care for a million people.

The local program assures victims of accident illness or injury of free and adequate supplies of blood for transfusions, surgical needs and general medical use.

The center banks whole blood and keeps it available in refrigeration for the use of any area hospital which requires it. The blood is typed and sent by air to any place which requests a supply for emergency or future use. All blood not used by the hospital within 18 days is re-

Ottawa Council, Boy Scouts of America, will hold a Camporee on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, June 4, 5 and 6. Over 2500 Scouts and Senior Scouts are expected to erect their tent city on the Warren Cutler Boy Scout Reservation.

Exhibit areas have been assigned to the following districts: Tomahawk — Tent pitching, showing proper erection of two-man hickory, baker, trail and tab tents using proper hitches, proper ditching and fully labeled. Western — Various types of cooking and heating fires, selection and care of firewoods, types of firewoods; Keystone — Reflection for cooking and tin can craft;

North Star — Rustic camp tools and camp gadgets; rustic camp furniture; Northern — Trail sanitation, proper food storage, fire fighting equipment; Pioneer — Light weight trail camping and equipment.

Competitive events will consist of Indian wrestling, wood sawing, fire by flint and steel, fire by friction and water boiling.
