

**Procession Held in Yokohama**  
 Yokohama (NC) — This former citadel of war became a citadel of peace and Christianity when an estimated 5,000 Catholics staged Japan's first public procession and profession of faith here.  
 Japanese and Americans — technically still enemies but brothers in the same faith — marched side by side through the busy streets of this city which was once the gun-bristling headquarters of the Japanese Navy.  
 The procession was led by Archbishop Paul Marella, Apostolic Delegate to Japan. A band from the United States Navy forces stationed here supplied the music. White and black-robed marchers knelt for the Archbishop's blessing which was also bestowed on all sections of the city and the naval base.
