100 in Operetta Cast Set At Blessed Sacrament Hall

A large cast of high school and grammar school students will present the Operetta "Bittersweet Anne," Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday evenings, June 9, 10 and 11 in Blessed Sacrament auditorium.

The production is being staged by the St. Cecilia Choral Society of Blessed Sacrament parish under the direction of Sister Madeline Louise, S.S.J., teacher of voice. The cast of over 100 members in the operetta and tableau staged to honor Monsignor Connors' Fifteenth Anniversary in the Holy Priesthood, includes students from Nazareth Academy, Mercy High School and others from Blessed Sacrament School. Anne Padelloro of Nazareth, cast as the Duke de Grassi, and Virginia Harden of Mercy, cast as his Duchess, will furnish plenty of merriment as pretenders to the throne. Dances include, Irish Jig, Pirate Dance, Brahms Waltz, Musical Comedy Routine, and Soft Shoe Rhythmic Dances. The Miles Ensign Jack McDonnell Studio trained the dancers. A Jubilee Tableau will be presented after the Operetta. Sister Helen Julius, S.L. of Springfield, Missouri, and Sister Mary Xavier, S.S.J. of Blessed Sacrament School will alternate at the piano.
