24 Teams In HNS School Softball League To Compete In Championship Playoffs

A series of playoff games to decide the champion among the 24 teams in the Holy Name Parochial School Softball League will be staged next week, with the final championship game slated for Saturday, June 12, at the Kodak Park Field, Lake Avenue.

His Excellency, Bishop Kearney, has been invited to the final game to award the championship trophy.

Permanent winners in the four divisions of the league will vie in the playoffs. A team will be eliminated on the loss of two games.

There will be two games on two different fields at 4 p. m. Monday, June 7. At 4 p. m. Wednesday the two Monday winners will play each other on one field, and the two Monday losers on another field. Thus, at the close of Wednesday's games there will be one team which, having lost two games, will be eliminated.

There will then be three teams remaining. One with no loss, two with one loss each. The last two will play at 4 p. m. Friday, thus eliminating one. Of the two remaining teams, one will be undefeated, the other will meet for the finals on Saturday, June 12, at 10:30 a. m. at Kodak Park.

If the undefeated team wins this morning game, it will be the league champion. If, however, it loses the game, thus tying the teams at one loss each, the final playoff will be staged at 2 p. m. Saturday at the Kodak Park Field. A representative of the New York State Softball Association will umpire the playoffs.

League teams, in the order of their division standing as of June 1, were as follows:

DIVISION 1: Holy Rosary, Nazareth Hall, St. Margaret, Mary, Sacred Heart, St. Thomas, St. Bridget.

DIVISION 2: St. Andrew, St. Michael, Holy Redeemer, St. Stanislaus, Mt. Carmel, Our Lady of Perpetual Help.

DIVISION 3: Holy Apostles, St. Lucy (tied for first), St. Monica, St. Augustine, St. Anthony, Holy Family.

DIVISION 4: St. Francis Xavier, Corpus Christi, St. Boniface, St. John the Evangelist, St. Ambrose, Blessed Sacrament.

Only one team, the peppery nine from St. Andrew's, was undefeated up to June 1, thus holding undisputed lead in Division 2. St. Francis Xavier held a good lead in Division 4. Division standings, however, easily could be considerably changed as a result of this week's games. Game results and news of the playoffs will be published in the daily press.

Playoff games will be on the following fields: Monday, Aquinas and No. 11 School, Webster Ave.; Wednesday, Aquinas and Ave. D; and Friday, Aquinas.

Several games remained to be played this week because of numerous rain-postponed tilts. Official division standings will be closed as of midnight Sunday. League officials have invited the public to view the playoff series and cheer on their favorites.
