**Vatican Says Christians Owe Peace to Holy Land**

Vatican City—(NC)—The Christian world owes more preparation to the Holy Land, "It owes it peace," writes Osservatore Romano in an editorial which asks that every effort be made in order to prevent "the atrocious irony, the blasphemous insult, that a field of battle would always be in the home land of the Prince of Peace."  
Speaking of the "spiritual abandonment" of the Holy Land, Osservatore declares that the Christian world, if it had been faithful in its duty toward the land of Jesus, would have loved Palestine and looked upon it as the home land of civilization, as a spot where everybody could be a guest-citizen, where questions of right and of conflict would not have been considered logical and possible.  
The editorial declares that, in accordance with the spirit of the encyclical letter "Auspicia Quaedam," it does not wish to take sides, it points to the dangers which even a small spark offers to the "powder keg" that is Europe and expresses the hope that Europe, facing a new conflict, may not act like a peasant who, sitting at the door of his cottage, indifferently watches the storm clouds descend upon fields that he has not plowed himself.  
"As the cradle of the world's redemption," Osservatore writes,

as a temple for believers, sacred to all for the revelation of liberty, justice and brotherhood and the highest culture which could illumine human paths, the fields of the Holy Land could be the heart of the world, where neither armed conquests nor the resentments which they leave behind would have led to new strife and battle, where no one would be removed from the sense of historical uniqueness surrounding its sacred places... and where the regime of Palestine would be considered a "world mandate."

**Growth of Catholic Action In Japan Rapid Since War**

Tokyo—(NC)—Catholic social action establishments in Japan have increased by 45 per cent, and Catholic schools by 17 per cent since the end of the war, according to an article by the Rev. Albert Bold, S. V. D., in the latest number of the Missionary Bulletin.  
Of equal if not greater importance are the figures given by Father Bold concerning the new books published in Japanese in the same period, the grand total being 165. This means that on the average one new book was issued every five days since August 15, 1945.  
With nine new schools established during the past two and a half years, the Church now has 17 schools for boys with a total enrollment of 3,287, and 46 schools for girls with 21,466 students. Practically all of these schools are of middle age or even higher grade since Catholic elementary schools are almost nonexistent.  
For the Catholic social action establishments the totals with figures for the increase since VJ Day in parentheses are as follows: Kindergartens, 69 (11); hospitals, 13 (4); dispensaries, 8 (3); orphanages, 19 (9); nurseries, 18 (8); homes for the aged, 9 (2); sanatoria, 6 (1); homes for
