C.S.C. Priest's First Mass Set In Bath Church

Bath—The Rev. Robert J. Fagan, C.S.C., son of Mr. and Mrs. James A. Fagan, of 8 Runsey Street, will celebrate his first Solemn High Mass in St. Mary's Church, Bath, at 10:30 a. m. Sunday, June 6.

Father Fagan, a member of the Congregation of Holy Cross, was ordained Wednesday, June 2, at Holy Cross College, Washington, D. C. by the Most Rev. Patrick Boyle, Archbishop of Washington.

A native of Bath and a graduate of Haverling High School, the new priest received his degree at Notre Dame University before entering the Holy Cross seminary. While at Notre Dame where his brothers, Bernard and Hewlett Fagan were also graduates, Father Fagan was a member of the Student Council and was active in numerous other campus organizations.

The Rev. Henry C. Maney, pastor of St. Mary's, will be assistant priest for Father Fagan's first Mass and will preach the sermon. The Rev. Arthur A. LeMay will be deacon and the Rev. John Corcoran, C.S.C., of Washington will be subdeacon at the Mass. Brother Meinrad, C.S.C., will be the master of ceremonies. Mr. James Fagan, father of the newly ordained priest, is a trustee of St. Mary's Church.

German Priest Saved Bruening's Life in '34

The life of Dr. Heinrich Bruening, former chancellor of Germany and now a member of the faculty of Harvard University, was saved by the Rev. Hermann Muckermann, S.J., of Berlin on June 30, 1934, it has now been revealed.

In connection with the Nazi "purge" which occurred on that day many Catholic leaders of Germany, too, were in danger of being caught in the Gestapo mesh. Father Muckermann, having heard that Chancellor Bruening was among them, offered to drive him to the Dutch border in his car and managed to get him across the line into Holland.
