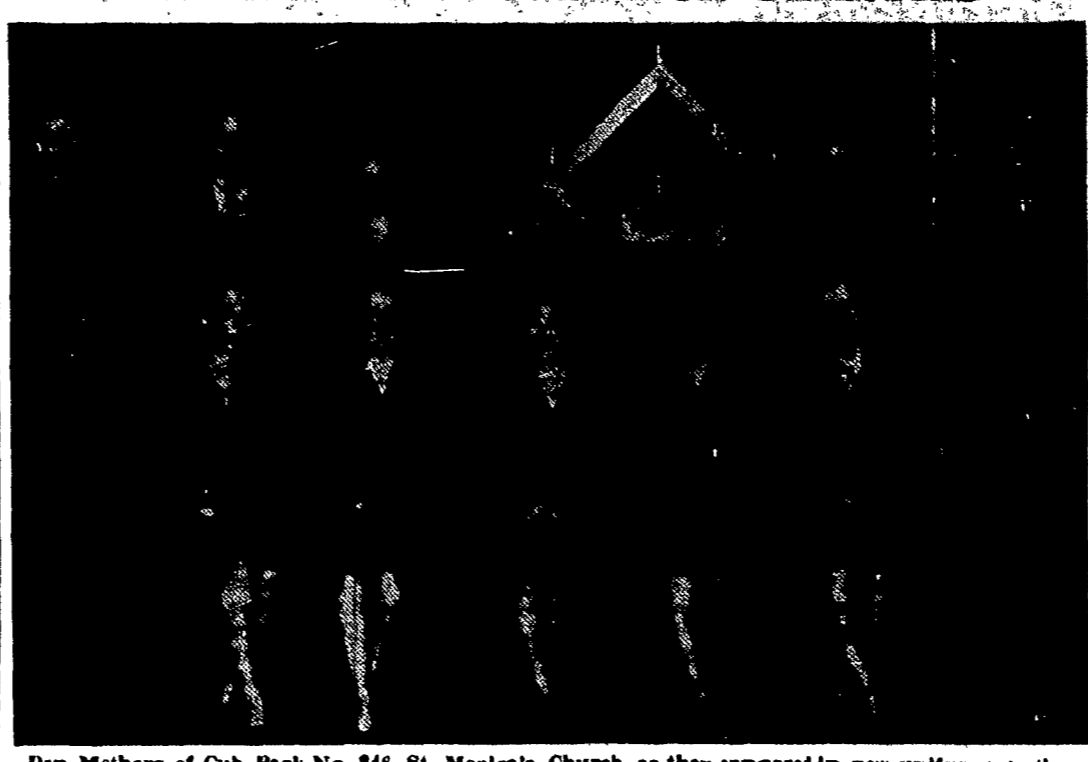

Harvard Scholarship Won by Aquinas Grad

Legal Aid Work Cited

Entirely supported by the Community Chest, the Rochester Legal Aid Society handles cases without fee for people unable to hire their own attorneys. Prevalent among current cases are eviction cases and services for members of the armed forces and veterans.

Many cases are handled by a panel constantly maintained by the Rochester Bar Association.

2,000,000 Destitute; Relief For Only 50,000

Hanchow (NC) — Two million persons are destitute in this area of northern Kiangsu, where the worst famine in years is raging. Civil war, drought and floods have brought starvation desperately near to 40 per cent of the population.

The Rev. J. Oscar Doyon, Canadian Jesuit, vice-chairman of the united relief committee formed here reports that relief supplies available to the committee will permit them to help only 50,000 out of the estimated 2,000,000 destitute.
