### 40 Confirmed By Bishop on First Visit To Sampson

Sampson—His Excellency Bishop Kearney made his first visit to Sampson College to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation on 40 members of the Sampson Community, Tuesday. The Bishop was received at the Chapel by a Guard of Honor from the Newman Club under the direction of Donald Miller and Thomas Johnston, past and present presidents of the club.

The color guards, James Caray and John Golden, carrying the American and Papal flags, followed by honor guards Herbert Varone, Norman Ladd (of St. Monica's Parish), Richard Harold (of Good Counsel Parish), Paul Bucko, Anthony DeLuca, Joseph Karaffa, William Nolan and George Thibault led the procession into the Chapel.

The Bishop and neighboring priests, escorted by members of the Acolytes Guild of Sampson, entered the Sanctuary and the Sacrament of Confirmation was conferred on a class of 40 members of the Sampson Community.

The Saint Gregory Choir of Sampson, under the direction of Mr. Leland Flora, director of Music of Sampson College, furnished the music for the occasion.

Following the Confirmation Service an oil painting of Our Lady of Fatima, executed by Dr. Arthur Spangher, professor in the Engineering Department was presented to the Chapel in honor of the Bishop's visit by the artist, and was blessed by the prelate.

Proceeding the Confirmation service a luncheon was tendered by Bishop Kearney by Dean Howard Thompson and members of the faculty. Among the guests were the Rev. Augustine Aylward, C.S.S.R. who conducted Retreats for Sampson students, the Rev. Gabriel Kearney, O. Carm. who assists Sundays at the College and Rt. Rev. Msgr. William McPadden, V. G., of Geneva.

After the luncheon an informal reception was held in the Faculty Club where hundreds of faculty, students and wives came to welcome the Bishop. They were presented to His Excellency by the Rev. Paul J. Cuddy, Catholic Chaplain and Dean, Thompson. Many of the married students brought their infants for the Bishop's blessing.

Before leaving the Campus, the Bishop visited a typical married student's apartment, the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Francis Hope. Mrs. Hope has a brother at Saint Bernard's Seminary and Mr. Hope has a sister at Nazareth College.

### Catholic Living Urged By Editor

Mr. Morris Lead full and active Catholic lives to counteract the growing danger of secularism, the Rev. Patrick J. Flynn, editor of the Catholic Courier Journal and diocesan director of Holy Name Societies told more than 100 men and women at LaDelfa Hotel here Monday.

The men and women were members of the Holy Name Society and the Rosary Society of St. Patrick's Church, respectively. Dinner was the occasion for greeting their pastor, the Rev. Lawrence W. Cannon able to get around again after a serious illness. Father Cannon presented Father Flynn.

The zeal of the communists must be emulated by Catholic men and women in their own communities to thwart the efforts of the godless, Father Flynn declared.

Pointing to the countries of Europe enslaved behind the Iron Curtain the speaker said that wherever God goes man is next. "Certain rights of man, he said, are God-given rights and 'no power has any right to outlaw these privileges given to us by no power in the world.' It is the taking away of men's rights which has resulted in the deplorable condition in Eastern Europe he said.

The war has heated the hearts to be aware of the new paganism and new atheism against which the Catholic Church is arrayed to fight for all men's rights that the Christian way will rule all lives.

Miss Gertrude Donovan, president of the Rosary Society presided at the dinner. At the speakers table also were Anthony Barone, president of the Holy Name Society of St. Patrick's Church here and Mr. and Mrs. Thomas P. O'Connor of Rochester.
