

When asked whether he had observed evidence of religious persecution by communists in China, the Cardinal responded: I saw refugees from communist trouble in China. 

This is the model for the statue which is to stand in front of the headquarters building of the National Catholic Welfare Conference in Washington, D. C. It is to be cast into a 17-foot bronze image, which is expected to be ready to be set in place early this Fall, according to Bishop John F. 
