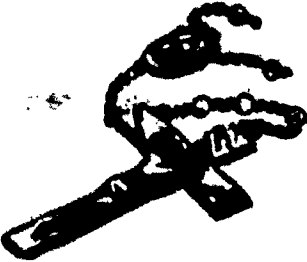

The chairman, Mrs. William Bush, has outlined a program which will be preceded by registration under the supervision of the Senior Girl Scouts, with Mrs. Gordon Jarvis in charge.

The opening ceremony will start with a parade of the Scout troops with massed flags. A Scout will lead the salute to the flag and another will lead the singing of "America." Mrs. Basil C. MacLean, second deputy Scout commissioner, will speak. She will be introduced by Miss Marie Moroney, director of the Maplewood District.

A game period from 3:15 to 4:15 will consist of ball games in a senior, intermediate and Brownie groups, with Mrs. William Ketchum, Mrs. I. S. Bradley and Mrs. L. Lipson, respectively, in charge.

An hour of skits and stunts will be in charge of Mrs. R. Richens, intermediates under Mrs. F. C. Nella. Seniors also will take part. The Brownie skit will be a folk dance in costume.

After the singing of grace at 5:15 led by a Scout, the girls will eat the picnic suppers they bring. A half-hour camp fire program will follow, with songs and a fire-lighting ceremony the features.

Rome's Irish College Made 'Pontifical'

Rome—(RNS)—The Irish College in Rome has been given the title "Pontifical." It was announced here in a decree issued by the Sacred Congregation of Seminaries and Universities and signed by Pope Pius XII. It is one of more than two dozen national colleges in Rome. Founded by Cardinal Ludovico in 1628 for the training of candidates to the priesthood, the Irish College was closed by order of Napoleon I, but was revived by a brief of Pope Leo XII in 1826. The present building dates from 1835.

They now number 35,263, or about 59 per cent of this country's population of 59,220. The Church is taking a leading part in reducing illiteracy here. It operates 44 of the 78 subsidized primary schools and maintains 17 non-aided schools.
