Courier Radio Show Quiet Till Aug. 29

The Sunday Edition of the Courier Journal closes a full year of broadcasts with a final program of editorial commentary on current events this Sunday at 12:10 p. m. on Rochester Station WHAM.

The Rev. Richard Torney, associate editor of the Courier Journal and weekly commentator for the radio-Sunday Edition, will turn the WHAM microphone over to a seven-week summer replacement of semiclassical music in the usual Courier Journal period during the month of July and part of August.

The weekly "Catholic editorial point of view" will be resumed on Sunday, August 29 with a full fall schedule of current news commentary, human interest tales, interviews and musical programs by parish and school choirs. The editors of the Courier Journal will welcome the comments and suggestions of weekly listeners who have enjoyed this year's "Sunday Edition."

THE SACRED HEART Program, a daily feature of Rochester Station WRNY, (680 kc.) at 6:45 each morning, announces the following topics for the short sermon in each morning's broadcast: Saturday, June 26, "The Father Almighty"; Monday, June 28, "I Believe in God"; Tuesday, June 29, "In Our Heart"; Wednesday, June 30, "God's Presence"; Thursday, July 1, "The Creator"; Friday, July 2, "God's Omnipotence." Each sermon will be preached by a different Jesuit Father from St. Louis. The remainder of each religious transcription consists of morning prayers and sacred music by the St. Louis University choir.

N.D. Opens Movie, Movie Projected Recording Center By Fr. Peyton

Notre Dame, Ind. Latest types of teaching aids will be made available to public and private schools in the Middle West by the new Audio-Visual Education Center opened recently at the University of Notre Dame.

The new center, equipped to make phonograph recordings, photographs silent and sound motion pictures, film strips and similar aids will supply the thirty-five academic departments at Notre Dame with educational pictures and recordings as teaching aids. A library of such aids covering every subject taught at the university also is being assembled. Present plans call for the new project to become eventually a center for audio-visual education for many mid-western elementary schools, high schools and colleges.

A new type "blackboard" is among equipment installed in the new center. The "blackboard," one of the first of its kind in the United States, is made of ground glass with fluorescent lighting behind it, and the instructor will use black or colored chalk. Window shades will be drawn and ceiling lights will be out while the board is in use.

Ten portable record players with headphones have been installed in the center for students of foreign languages. The students may sit alone in a booth and play records for language lessons. Similar recordings are planned for other studies.

FM Licenses Vacated In 'Red-Front' Issue

Washington, NC—The Federal Communications Commission this week vacated licenses it had granted to the Unity Corporation to construct FM broadcasting stations in Springfield and Mansfield, Ohio. Edward Lamb, principal stockholder of the Corporation, has been accused of close affiliation with communist front organizations.

Representative J. Parnell Thomas of New Jersey, chairman of the House Un-American Activities Committee, said Lamb had followed the Communist party line and had associated himself with numerous communist fronts which have been set up during the past 10 years. He also directed attention to a book entitled "The Planned Economy in Soviet Russia," written by Mr. Lamb in 1934.
