Reds in Bogota Revolt Wore Clergy Garb, Bishops Say

Bogota, Colombia—While Government authorities are engaged in repairing the material destruction caused by the short-lived Colombian revolt in April, the Catholic Hierarchy has appealed to all Christians in a joint pastoral to cooperate in building up a "Christian social order in which justice and charity rather than violence and hate may reign."

The pastoral denies accusations that priests fired on the people from church towers during the revolt, and brands instances cited as the work of anti-clerical revolutionaries who "disguised themselves in ecclesiastical robes to stir up the fury of the people against the clergy."

Evidence here shows that many communists dressed themselves as priests with cassocks they stole from convents and sacristies they plundered. Many were still dressed in cassocks when their dead bodies were taken from the bellies and off the streets.

An article in a recent issue of The Christian Century, self-styled "undenominational" weekly, charges that "some members of the clergy engaged in armed warfare on the day the revolution broke out." The writer of the article, principal of an Episcopalian school in Bogota states he "personally saw six priests firing from the cathedral towers."

Ithaca — The slave who freed himself by uttering one chain-shattering "No!" is the key figure in the second of the "Foundations of Our American Ideals" radio drama series, presented by the Supreme Council, Knights of Columbus.

The "Foundations" series reconstructs the historic events which form the background and the basis of Jefferson's immortal phrase.

To Replace Cathedral Ogdensburg, N. Y. (NC)—A campaign has been inaugurated in the Ogdensburg diocese for funds to replace St. Mary's Cathedral, destroyed in a fire last November. Bishop Bryan J. McEwart of Ogdensburg explained in announcing the campaign that engineers have found that a rebuilding of the old church would be an expensive and doubtful operation. A cathedral of stripped Gothic architecture is planned as the replacement.
