Tokyo—(NC)—Tosel News, official Catholic news agency designated to provide copy for the general press in Japan, has been inaugurated here at a dinner attended by Prime Minister Ashida, Dr. Kotaro Tanaka, only Catholic member of the House of Councillors, and representatives of all the large Japanese and English-language dailies in Tokyo.

 unable to obtain any standard, higher class magazines from his regular dealer. Claiming that "a tie-in deal" was forcing dealers to distribute unwholesome comics in order to get the national magazines for older customers, Kelly was soon supported by national publishing companies who sent telegrams and representatives to declare that they had never countenanced the withholding of their publications from a retail dealer who refused other printed matter offered by a local distributor.

Public reaction which followed brought general condemnation of comics by clergymen of all faiths, teachers, parents and doctors. THE RT. REV. MSGR. William J. Brian, V.F. Dean of the Elmira Diocese, in a formal statement reviewed the resolution against indecent magazines and comics made at the diocesan Holy Name Convention held in Elmira in May and a deacons assembly in October.
