Catholic Radio Figures Hold Boston Meeting

Boston — (NC) — The Catholic Broadcasters of the United States and Canada will hold a charter convention at St. John's Seminary, Brighton, from July 2 to 4, under the auspices of Archbishop Richard J. Cushing of Boston.

It is expected that some 200 members, including many prominent persons in the radio field, will be in attendance. The principal business of the convention will be the drafting of a constitution and by-laws.

AMONG THOSE who will attend are the Rev. Patrick Peyton, C.S.C., founder and director of The Family Theater program; the Rev. Eugene Murphy, S.J., director of the Sacred Heart program; William C. Smith, radio director of the National Council of Catholic Men; Edward Stashoff, director of public service and educational programs for television Station WPIX, New York; and Hugh M. P. Higgins, assistant director of broadcast advertising of the National Association of Broadcasters, Washington.

Discussion of Catholic program material and successful techniques of religious broadcasting will feature speakers from many dioceses who will demonstrate methods of presenting music, news, sermons and religious drama.

Archbishop Cushing will address the convention and also will offer a Mass for the delegates on July 4 in the seminary chapel.

Attending the convention from Rochester will be the Rev. Richard Torrey, associate editor of the COURIER-JOURNAL, the Rev. John T. Callahan, chaplain of Mercy High School, Edwin Dolan, Martin Q. Noe and Arthur P. Farren, active members of the K. of C. Radio Speakers Bureau.

Father Torrey has been responsible for Catholic broadcasts on Station WHAM and WRET, while Father Callahan has produced several series of religious programs on WHEC, WSAY and WRNY. Members of the Speakers Bureau have broadcast regularly on WRNY.

Pope Praises NCCW Relief For Children

New York — (NC) — His Holiness Pope Pius XII has imparted a special Apostolic Benediction to each member of the Catholic women's groups affiliated with the National Council of Catholic Women who has taken part in the "Children in Need" clothing collection to aid the war needy, according to advices received here by Msgr. Edward E. Swanstrom, executive director of War Relief Services—National Catholic Welfare Conference. The campaign already has resulted in raising more than 4,000,000 garments for war needy children.

Under the sponsorship of the N.C.W. all Catholic women's groups now are united in a special campaign of collecting new garments for the children of devastated lands and a goal of 5,000,000 pieces of clothing has been fixed. The clothing will be sent to "The Storehouse of the Holy Father" and will be distributed under his direction.

The Rochester Diocese as a N.C.W. has adopted plans to reach every door by clothing and aid the drive for baby clothing and children's wear which will be sent to Rome for distribution by the Vatican. The Rev. John T. Callahan, chaplain of Mercy High on Blossom Road, will supervise forwarding of contributions of clothing left at the school this month and during the summer.

The Pope's appreciation for the work of the Catholic women of the United States is expressed in his blessing which states: "How could We fail to be moved to the depths of an anxious paternal heart by the constancy of our American Catholic women's devotion to the world's Children in Need."

The blessing of the Holy Father was contained in the following message received by Msgr. nor Swanstrom: "In token of Mother Church's gratitude to the Catholic women of the United States for their continuing solicitude for the welfare of the orphaned and holy innocents We grant in part to each and every member of your faithful service group, to their officials and to all who assist them, the Apostolic Benediction."

The purpose of the series is to reenact great moments in the history of mankind's struggle for human liberty over tyrants and power-seekers.
