

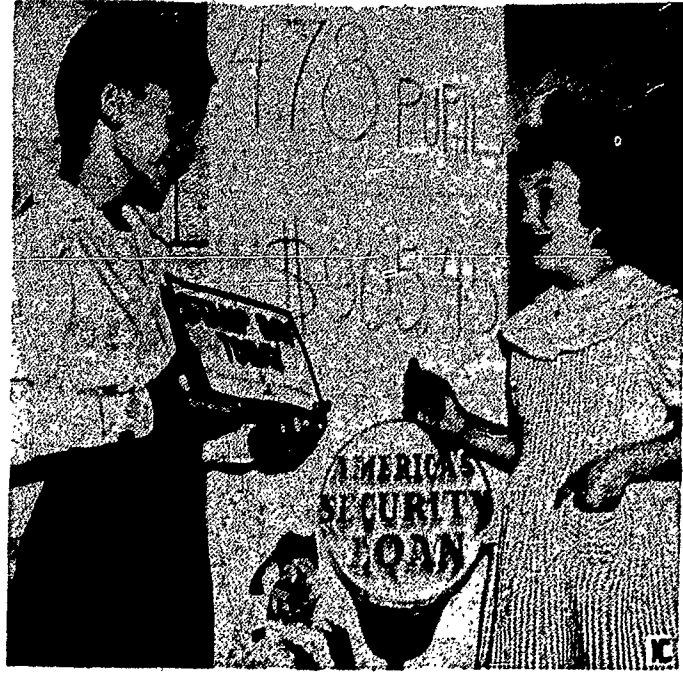

Father Cameron Addresses Grads

Informally speaking to the graduates at the conclusion of his talk, Father Cameron reminded them of the deep spiritual truths which are a part of their American heritage.

"I," he said, "knew nothing of God. I would have learned God reading the preamble of the Declaration of Independence; the power, beauty and necessity of religion and morality I would have learned in the words of George Washington; the relation between man and his Maker I would have learned from Abraham Lincoln.

"You graduates are America," he concluded, "to you is being handed the torch. Grasp it firmly and walk steadfastly in the path of your forebears. Keep your eyes on the stars of American principles, ideals and culture, for in your America lies the hope of the World."

Belgium Reinters American Dead

Antwerp, Belgium - (NC) - The first of an estimated 17,000 bodies of American dead, among them several thousand Catholics, have been reinterred in the new cemetery at Henry-Chapelle near Liege, Belgium.

The American embassy in Brussels has asked and obtained a promise from the Belgian government that the new 50-acre cemetery and its surroundings will be classified as reserved territory, thus prohibiting any activity incompatible with respect due to the dead.

The United States Army's Graves Registration Command reveals that of the 136,225 Americans killed in Europe during World War II, 65 per cent of the identified bodies have been repatriated to the United States at the request of families of the deceased. About 25,000 of the American dead are reported as lost.

Half Million Estate Left To Charities

Cleveland-NC - The entire estate of John E. Crow, 81, vice president and director of the Sterling & Welch Co. here, valued at approximately \$500,000, has been bequeathed to Catholic charities, according to application for probate of the will.

The will provides the following bequests: The Catholic Charities Corporation, 35 per cent; the Ursuline Sisters, 20 per cent; the work in Cleveland and vicinity; the Little Sisters of the Poor, 20 per cent; St. Vincent Charity Hospital, 15 per cent; and John Carroll University, 10 per cent.

Mr. Crow, who was a Knight of St. Gregory, has long been associated with the work of Catholic Charities here. He had been a trustee of the corporation since 1919 and had made liberal contributions to the organization. He also was a trustee of St. Vincent Charity Hospital. He was a bachelor and the only surviving member of his family.
