Post Office Alters Foreign Mail Rules

Three changes in foreign mail regulations were announced by Postmaster Donald A. Dailley this week.

Cigarettes and tobacco products may not be mailed to Army Post Office 209 located in Trieste and Army Post Office 794, located in Italy. The use of dispatch note Form 2072 has been discontinued on parcel post packages addressed to French possessions in Africa and Indian and to Ethiopia.

Quantity of food, medicines, clothing, soap and other relief supplies which may be mailed to civilians in Japan has been limited by controlling authorities in Japan. Persons wishing to send such packages should inquire at the Foreign Section of the Main Post office or at sub-stations concerning quotas of mailable items.

Reports of Papal Illness Denied by Vatican Paper

Rome, (AP)—A formal report in the Italian press regarding the health of Pope Pius XII was denied here by Osservatore Romano, official Vatican newspaper.

"These reports are all the more unreasonable," Osservatore declared, "as the Pope continues to grant audiences and makes speeches and has just held a consistorium."

In lighter tone, Osservatore recalled that two centuries ago Pope Benedict XIV declared that "if I continue to fail ill and promptly recover, people will no longer say Holy Father but Eternal Father."


