New British Film Viewed By Cardinal

London.—(NC)—The Church's "constructive interest" in the cinema rather than her role as censor was emphasized by His Eminence Bernard Cardinal Griffin, Archbishop of Westminster, at London's West End cinema.

AFTER CONGRATULATING the producer, Andrew Buchanan, and the Catholic Film Society now making its influence felt in the cinema world, the Cardinal declared "I should like to emphasize the fact that the Church has always taken a constructive interest in films as a popular and important means of entertainment and instruction. Its function has not been merely that of a censor."

Catholic Broadcasters Organize, Aim to Spread Church's Program

Boston.—(NC)—Many Catholics must be awakened to the fact that the social program of the Church is a liberal and dynamic thing, the Rev. Harold C. Gardiner, S.J., literary editor of America, weekly Catholic magazine, told the 200 clergy and laity at the charter convention of the Association of Catholic Broadcasters at St. John's Seminary, Bishop John J. Wright, Auxiliary of Boston, offered the Mass which opened the convention and at its close held a reception to the delegates from all over the United States.

"MANY CATHOLICS are insufficiently informed on the events of the day," Father Gardiner continued "I have heard some express an isolationist point of view on the Marshall Plan. The Marshall Plan is a Christian charity which must be the basis of our activities."
