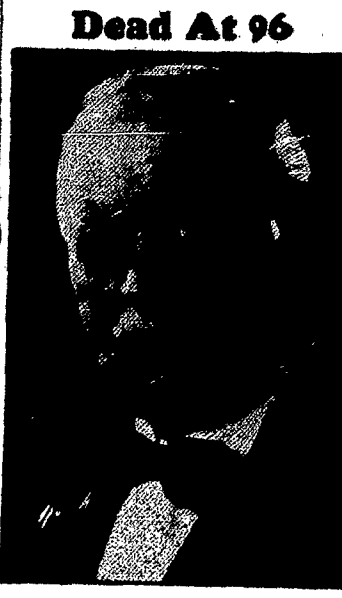

Frank O'Brien's Final Rites Held

Shortsville—Funeral services for Frank O'Brien, 78, former Ontario County Sheriff and lifelong resident of this area were conducted by the Rev. John E. Napier, pastor in St. Dominic's Church, Wednesday.

Mr. O'Brien died Sunday, July 11, 1948. The body was at the Stoddard & Sons Funeral Home prior to the church services. Burial was in St. Rose's Cemetery, Shortsville.

Born in Littleville, south of Shortsville, on July 14, 1870, he was the son of Patrick and Mary O'Brien.

He attended school here and entered into several businesses, including retail ice delivery and produce, and later as a contractor he hauled by team many of the rails used in laying the Lehigh Railroad through Manchester.

Mr. O'Brien also became game protector and sheriff for several years. In 1924 he was elected as superintendent of highways for the Town of Manchester, which post he held until 1942.

A member of the Knights of Columbus Council in Canandaigua, he held memberships in St. Dominic's Church and the Shortsville Citizen's Home Company.

He leaves his widow, Mrs. Margaret B. O'Brien; two sons, Francis J. O'Brien and Robert B. O'Brien, all of Rochester; two brothers, Martin O'Brien of Shortsville and John O'Brien of Dundee; and two grandchildren in Rochester.
