Office Set Up For Mission Aid to Japan

Arlington, Va.—NC—An American branch of the Rehabilitation Committee of the Catholic Church in Japan has been formed to facilitate the shipment of mission supplies to that country. In response to the offer of the Immaculate Heart of Mary missionaries, the branch is using the facilities of their United States headquarters here for its central office.

The American branch of the Rehabilitation Committee is headed by John G. Liebert of Washington, D. C., who became a member of the committee at its founding in January, 1946, while serving as legal counsel for SCAP (Supreme Command of the Allied Powers) in Japan. He was commissioned to form the American branch by Archbishop Marella, Apostolic Delegate to Japan.

The Rev. John K. Connelly, director of promotion at the Immaculate Heart of Mary headquarters here, has been chosen associate director of the branch. Liebert is now in the process of forming a counseling body, which he hopes will include representatives of all the U. S. religious communities having missionaries in Japan.

WHILE ALL MISSION supplies to Japan previously had to be sent either through the Army or LARA (Licensed Agencies for Relief in Asia), a new arrangement worked out by SCAP on January 15 of this year, permits Liebert to send supplies directly to missionaries in Japan. Since his return to the United States in November, 1946, he has arranged for large shipments of food, and other supplies to Japan missions.

The American branch of the Rehabilitation Committee, Liebert emphasized, will coordinate its activities to use to the fullest extent the facilities of War Relief Services—National Catholic Welfare Conference and other existing relief groups interested in supplying Japanese Catholic missions. The branch will lean heavily especially on War Relief Services—N. C. W. C., he added, as a source of supplies.

Catholics, Protestants In Bavaria Share Radio

Frankfurt, Germany—NC—If a suitable radio frequency can be obtained, a radio station programmed exclusively by Christian standards will soon be in operation at Bamberg, Bavaria, under joint Catholic-Protestant auspices. The governing board will be headed by Archbishop Joseph Kolb of Bamberg and Protestant Bishop Hans Meiser of Munich.

The station is to operate non-commercially and the programs will be planned by Catholics and Protestants on alternate days. It is hoped that the broadcasts will be heard in the nearby southern parts of the Russian zone of occupation.

THE AMERICAN MILITARY Government has agreed in principle to the project. It remains to be seen whether the conference now being held at Copenhagen, Denmark, to set up a new European radio frequency plan will allocate a proper wavelength to the Bamberg station.

Catholic broadcasts are now heard regularly on all radio stations in the three western zones of Germany. The French-controlled station at Koblenz allots a 45-minute spot to Catholics every Sunday; while the stations in the American and British zones give time for Catholic programs on a fortnightly schedule.

In Munich in the U. S. zone there are Catholic programs on two consecutive Sundays, while every third Sunday is reserved for the Protestant Church. Catholic news is broadcast every Saturday for 15 minutes. In Stuttgart there is a half-hour Catholic program every other Sunday while the Sundays in between provide an interdenominational Christian news report. A similar arrangement prevails in Frankfurt while Bremen, also under American jurisdiction, has a one-hour Catholic program once a month.

IN THE BRITISH ZONE, the stations of Hamburg, Cologne, Hanover and Flensburg devote ten minutes every day to a brief religious service, one week being turned over to the Catholics and the other to the Protestants. Besides, there is a religious news report every Sunday and a fortnightly one-hour Catholic program.

The situation in Berlin is unique owing to the special status of the city. Catholic broadcasts are scheduled there every other Sunday over the Soviet-controlled station. The American station provides a Catholic hour. It also gives time for a Catholic youth program once a month.

In the French zone, outside of Koblenz, the station of Freiburg has a special fortnightly Catholic broadcast and a Catholic youth program once a month. Distinguished Catholic priests and laymen cooperate closely with the various stations in arranging these programs. Best known among them are Father Melchior Grossek in Berlin, Father Wilhelm Peuler in Koblenz and Father Hermann Breucha in Stuttgart.

U. S. Middies Visit Vatican

 Vatican City—(NC)—Post-war Rome is back to normal. For once again it has become the treasured port of call for the midshipmen of the U. S. Navy on their summer Mediterranean cruise.

Three separate groups of them descended upon the Eternal City from Leghorn and Genoa with practically one thought in mind: to have an audience with the Pope. Thanks to the generosity of His Holiness, they departed from Rome with their mission accomplished, and carrying with them a vivid picture of the center of Christendom. Most of all, of course, they were impressed with the dignity, kindness, and graciousness of the Vicar of Christ.

FROM A SQUADRON of U. S. Cruisers and Destroyers, a group of some 350 officers, midshipmen and enlisted men, under the guidance of the Rev. (Lt. Cmdr.) Arthur P. Finan, C.S.S.R., of the Catholic University of America, and the Rev. (Lt. Cmdr.) Thomas Corneley, of Brooklyn, came down to Rome for a day and a half of sight-seeing.

Owing to a mix up in the transportation facilities, only half the group was on hand for the scheduled audience at 9 a. m. Lined up along all four walls of the Sala Clementina, a great hush fell upon the crowd as His Holiness entered.

The Pope appeared to be in good health, though he looked just a trifle tired. He expressed his joy at being able to welcome the group to the Vatican, spoke to Fathers Finan and Corneley for a few moments, and then started his round of the Sala, giving each sailor a word of greeting. He then posed with chaplains, midshipmen and sailors for a group picture, before extending to all present their families and loved ones, his Apostolic Blessing.

WHEN THE SECOND group, whose delay had prevented them from being at the scheduled audience, arrived about two hours later the Holy Father granted them an audience too, despite the fact that he had been trying to prepare for his going to the summer residence at Castelgandolfo.

Midshipmen and officers next toured the mighty basilica of St. Peter's with its magnificent murals, altars, pictures and statues, then went through the Vatican Museum and Library, viewing their treasures, and their archeological collections.

Film Classifications Published by Legion

New York (NC) A classification of 440 films made by the Legion of Decency here between November 1946 and November 1947 and presented to the U. S. Bishops at their annual meeting in Washington last fall has now been published here in pamphlet form by the legion.

A table on the 440 films classified shows that 195 were approved for general patronage, 172 more were approved for adults only, 70 were considered objectionable in part and three were wholly condemned.

Catholic Unit To Entertain For Olympic

London—NC—More than 1,000 Catholic athletes and officials are expected for the Olympic Games opening in London toward the end of this month.

To welcome them—and other Catholic visitors to Britain—a Catholic Hospitality Committee has been set up here under the leadership of Bishop George L. Craven, Bishop of Westminster. This committee is taking no part in the Olympic arrangements for these visitors but will try to help and entertain them on arrival.

"It is 40 years since the Olympic Games were held in Britain," Bishop Craven pointed out. "It may be 40 years before Britain's turn comes again. The opportunity to show Catholic hospitality is exceptional, and we hope that the committee's efforts will receive a wide measure of support."

FIRST HOSPITALITY function scheduled is a dance at the big London West End Lyceum Theatre on August 11 to which all Catholics taking part in the games will be invited.

His Eminence Bernard Cardinal Griffin, Archbishop of Westminster, will hold a reception for the Olympic sportsmen in the Archbishop's House after a special Benediction service in Westminster Cathedral on Sunday, August 1.

A small leaflet-guide to Catholic London will be presented to Catholic participants. Guides to show them around the capital are also being arranged.
