Formula Room, Paging System Plans Revealed

Auburn—A new milk laboratory or "formula" room is now nearing completion at Mercy Hospital, a Community Chest Agency, and will be under the supervision of Sister Francine. The room, equipped with all modern equipment, will be used for the preparation of formulas for infants.

Planned since last January, it is expected to be in operation by the end of July when the last piece of equipment, a sterilizer donated by the Auburn Elks, is delivered. The cost of the much-needed room has been around \$3,000.

ANOTHER ADDITION to the increasing facilities at Mercy Hospital, according to Sister Aurelia, is the Treatment Room, which has been in operation since last February. It fills the need of minor surgery near the maternity and children's ward where simpler operations may be performed without use of the main operating room on the top floor.

The Treatment Room will provide for transfusions for older children and infants' spinal injections and general physical treatments. A new green tile wall covering is expected to be added to complete the room whenever funds are available. The supervision of this room is also under Sister Francine.

Mercy Hospital is also about to have its new paging system completed with only a few boxes left to be installed. This system, the cost of which was met by the hospital physicians, will provide remote control operation to relieve the usual burden on a switchboard. The system has been obtained through rental agreement with the manufacturers.

Priest, Who Masked As Slave To Aid Ceylonese, Honored

Goa, India—The Government of the most influential into priest of Goa has completed arrangements for issuing a postage stamp honoring the Rev. Joseph Vaz, saintly Goa-born priest who, disguised as a slave, secretly ministered to Catholics on the island of Ceylon at the end of the 17th century. The priest has already been declared a Venerable by the Holy See and his cause for beatification is steadily progressing.

Born of a Brahmin convert family here, Father Vaz determined to go to Ceylon shortly after the Dutch had driven the Portuguese out of the island and decreed as one of their first acts the expulsion of all Catholic missionaries. Only one ailing Jesuit priest was permitted to stay and he was later beheaded for not revealing a secret made known to him in confession.

Father Vaz was 34 years old at the time and had been chosen Superior of the Oratorian Fathers in Goa. Consideration of the plight of the priestless Catholics of Ceylon forced him to relinquish his office and, disguised as a slave, he made the journey to Ceylon in a small vessel taking with him only a breviary and Mass equipment.

He was in the island only a few months when he had contacted most of the Catholics and, said Mass for them regularly. On Christmas night, 1690, the Catholics of Jaffa, where the priest was laboring, had assembled in three different places to assist at Masses in the absence of Father Vaz. However, Dutch soldiers raided one of the meeting places. The Dutch governor placed heavy fines on the men and threw eight

Religious Reconstruction Seen Swift In Poland

New York—(NC)—The reconstruction of religious life in Poland is proceeding swiftly because of the extraordinary courage of the Polish clergy, the Rev. Stanislaus J. Pliwowski, secretary general of the Catholic League for Religious Assistance in Poland, reported on his return from a six-week visit there.

Father Pliwowski thoroughly investigated the present situation in Poland, particularly religious conditions, and will report on his findings before the national convention of the Catholic League in Philadelphia next October. The priest visited all the Polish dioceses, spoke with 42 Polish bishops, and conferred with representatives of charitable and youth organizations.
