Funeral services for Sister M. Rita Schantz of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph were held Tuesday morning, July 27, 1948, at the Motherhouse in Pittsford.

Sister Rita died Sunday, July 25, 1948 in St. Mary's Hospital after a brief illness.

Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Charles F. Shay, assisted by the Rev. John S. Whalen, deacon; the Rev. Paul G. Wohliab, subdeacon; the Rev. William M. Hart, master of ceremonies; the Rev. Elmer McNamara and the Rev. Paul Gibbons, acolytes.

IN THE SANCTUARY were the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Thomas F. Connors, the Rev. Joseph Gefell and the Rev. Louis Edelman. Blessing at the grave in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery was imparted by Father Gefell, assisted by Monsignor Shay, the Rev. Charles McCarthy and the Reverend Fathers Wohliab, Gibbons and Hart.

Sister Rita entered the community in 1911 and spent the first 15 years of her religious life as housekeeper at the Motherhouse. At the time of her death, she was housekeeper at Holy Rosary Convent.

Surviving are three sisters, Mrs. May Wagner and Mrs. Florence Ferge, both of Rochester, and Mrs. Eva Perkins of Spencerport.

Irish Priest Who Aided Boy In Plane Crash Visits Here

The missionary priest who befriended little Paul Vick, 142 Harvard St., and his fatally-injured father, the Rev. Mr. Robert A. Vick, when their plane crashed over China last week and called on the orphaned little boy and his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Vick.

He is the Rev. Michael McCarthy, a Columbian Father, and native of Cork, Eire, bound for Eire on his first trip home in 17 years. Father McCarthy arrived here Sunday to visit at the home of Mrs. Catherine Manning, 242 Dorchester Rd.

THE IRISH PRIEST'S parish in Tien Mein, Hupeh Province, China was the scene of the tragic air accident Jan. 28, 1947, which claimed the lives of the Rev. Mr. Vick, Mrs. Dorothy Vick and Paul's three-year-old brother, Theodore.

It was Father McCarthy who comforted the dying Protestant missionary and received his final instructions for the care of the 16-month-old survivor, Paul, whose legs were broken. He also helped arrange for the transportation of the boy to Rochester.

"Rochester should be proud of the Rev. Mr. Vick," said the priest. "He was a fine Christian man and a source of consolation and edification for me."

During his seventeen years missionary service in China, Father McCarthy has lived in an atmosphere of constant war. Only two years of his apostolate were free of aggression by the Japanese or the Communists.

IN WORLD WAR II, despite the neutrality of Ireland, the priest was virtually a prisoner. In his own residence for two years, and for three more years was confined by the Japanese who looted his church. Other prisoners were executed on

He entered the Army October 15, 1942, and trained at Camp Edwards, arriving overseas in September, 1943. He was a member of an anti-aircraft coast artillery unit.

Besides his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Enright, 1547 South Ave., he leaves one brother, Joseph Enright; one sister, Mrs. James Small, and several nieces and nephews.
