An enlarged program of evening courses will be offered by Nazareth College next Fall with the addition of many cultural and scientific studies not previously offered, college authorities have announced.

Sisters in South To Edit Primer

St. Augustine, Fla.—NC—A committee of eleven teaching Sisters from eight different religious communities, representing the Catholic school systems in Alabama, Georgia and Florida, is at work here in an effort to adopt a common course of study in all subjects for the first to the fourth grades.

It is planned to have another committee of Sisters undertake a similar work for the fifth to the eighth grades in the summer of 1949 and thus provide an integrated course of studies for Catholic elementary schools of the three dioceses in the South.

Work of the Sisters in St. Augustine has attracted attention of Catholic educators in other parts of the South and the course of studies may be adopted by other dioceses in the 1949-50 school year. The work aims at relating Catholic social teaching more closely to the subject matter in the course studied in the earlier grades.

THE COMMITTEE expects to have prepared by summer's end, one teaching manual for each grade from the first to the fourth. The group's work is based on the Catholic curriculum for elementary schools "Guiding Growth in Christian Social Living," by Sisters Mary Joan and Mary Nona, published by the Commission on American Citizenship at the Catholic University of America, Washington, D. C.

Bishops Joseph P. Hurley of St. Augustine; Thomas J. Toolen of Mobile, and Gerald P. O'Hara of Savannah-Atlanta, are co-ordinators in the tri-State plan to achieve the highest ideals of Catholic education through social teaching.

Interment was in the family lot in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery with Rev. Bartholomew Quirk giving the final blessing.

Surviving are a daughter, Mrs. Michael McCarthy, and Mr. Sharpe's twin brother, J. Earl Sharpe, former deputy sheriff, also several nieces and nephews.

Genevans Help Redecorate Small Parish in Heidelberg

Geneva—Genevans have stretched charitable "hands across the sea" to aid members of a little war-devastated Catholic Church in Heidelberg, Germany.

Major General Francis B. Wilby (Retired) of St. Clair Street went into action when he received an appeal from a friend, Brig. Gen. Phillip E. Gallagher, director of military posts in Germany.

Major Wilby transmitted the appeal to Genevans, who contributed generously to a fund to assist in rehabilitation work at St. Ann's Church in Heidelberg.

The contributions were taken to the German parish by Mr. and Mrs. C. T. Lynch, South Main Street, who acted as representatives of the local group.

SPECIAL HONORS were paid the Genevans by American officials in Germany and by the congregation of St. Ann's in appreciation of the American assistance.

A Solemn High Mass was cele-

brated by U. S. Army chaplains, the Reverends William K. Graw, John T. Schag and Richard Hauser, director of German Catholic churches for the Heidelberg area. The Mass was in thanksgiving for those who had donated aid.

Members of the German parish have volunteered to donate their labor toward the rehabilitation work.

Among contributors to the rehabilitation fund were the Rt. Rev. Msgr. William H. Mcadden, pastor of St. Stephen's Church; the Rev. Edward K. Ball, pastor of St. Francis de Sales Church; Major Wilby, James M. Ryan, William J. Brennan, Thomas K. Fahy and James F. Hobbins.

Mrs. and Mr. Lynch are expected to tour France, England, Scotland and Ireland before returning home.
