Poverty Sparred Priest's Hobby of Making Violins

Providence — (NC) — The violin is the medium of expression for two skills belonging to a local priest. The Rev. Angelo Lapolla, of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church here, not only is a gifted violinist but he makes his instruments with his own hands.

Father Lapolla started his hobby of making violins about 10 years ago as a sentimentarian, when he was faced with the problem of getting a better instrument to replace his well-worn, \$10 model. He couldn't afford to buy one, so beginning with a piece of spruce clappedboard from a house, he constructed a violin. One violin led to another, and the priest now owns 11 beautiful instruments, each excellent in tonal quality and power.

FATHER LAPOLLA inevitably became a student of woods and their properties in relation to violin-making. He likes spruce with a close, straight grain for the top and maple for the back. He searches out old pieces of spruce from razed buildings. One piece that became a violin top came from an old beam in the Butler Exchange Building here, another came from a joist in a century-old structure on Westminster Street. He also makes use of the unusual: coccoawood, tulipwood, rosewood, to get unusual color effects in the pegs and tailpieces.

To gauge the varying thicknesses of top and back, Father Lapolla made his own micrometer out of a part from a phonograph, a small gear from a telephone dial, an aluminum pocket comb, and other odds and ends.

The priest already has more instruments than he will ever need, but he continues to make new ones, following the craftsman's urge to improve his product. And before he lays down his tools for good, he has an ambition to fulfill: the making of a cello.

German Labor Fears 'Want' Ads

Berlin — (CP) — Reports received from various parts of the Soviet Zone of Germany indicate that skilled workers are becoming increasingly suspicious of "Men Wanted" ads published in newspapers because a number of their colleagues who answered such ads were visited by Russian officials and, soon afterwards, mysteriously disappeared.

No figures are available on how many workers with special qualifications have been deported to Russia as a result of letters of application responding to ads giving box number addresses of Soviet Zone newspapers but the belief is widespread in labor circles that this method of recruiting has been used on a large scale.

Parents Occupy Classrooms In French School Struggle

Paris — (NC) — When a group of civil officials came to take possession of the Catholic school in the coal mining town of Ricamarie, they found the classrooms occupied by parents by parents who refused to vacate unless assured they would be given new premises for their school.

Recent nationalization of the schools provided for nationalization of the schools on the same premises as well, and the officials, including the communist mayor and the police commissioner, were seeking to enforce this measure.

Following action by a number of courts in Brittany in acquitting priests and laymen accused of refusing to pay the tax on schools organized for the support of the Christian schools, the Court of Appeals in Rennes has imposed a fine of 500 francs on each of the defendants. The court stated that while the honorableness and good intentions of the defendants are not in question, yet the law as it now stands must be enforced.

With Catholic parents making every effort to contribute to the support of the Christian schools, it has been announced that the court of general Leclerc de Hautecloque, World War II hero, contained a request of 8,000 francs to the support of the Christian schools. The sum, the general's will said, was saved by economizing on smoking.

Liturgy Week Opens August 2 in Boston

Boston — (NC) — Three bishops will serve as homilists at Masses offered during the ninth annual Liturgical Week which will open in this city on August 2. It has been announced.

The bishops are the Most Revs. James L. Connolly, Coadjutor of Fall River, Daniel F. Feeney, Auxiliary of Portland, Me., and John J. Wright, Auxiliary of Boston. Magr. Augustine F. Hickey, Vicar General of Boston, will serve in a similar capacity.

Theme of the meetings will be the Sacrament of Baptism. Archbishop Richard J. Cushing of Boston will address the convention.

Catholics and Lutherans Fight Birthcontrol Clinic

St. Louis, Mo. — (NC) — Leaders of and Roman Catholic and Lutheran churches demanded that a birth control clinic be ousted from the county health center here. Their request was made at meetings held by the advisory committee of the St. Louis County Health Department.

A St. Louis court previously had ordered the clinic out of the center, but later reconsidered and ruled to abide by the findings of the advisory committee.

Bernard Huger, lawyer representing Roman Catholic Archbishop Joseph E. Ruffini, said the clinic and its activities were illegal in Missouri.

Dr. Eugene Bettegum, representing forty-five Lutheran churches here, backed up the Catholic stand.

Terraces flanked the Dr. J. J. Bontenhamer, county health chairman, said most people opposed to the clinic were Catholics and used birth control devices.

Father J. Edgar Hines, pastor of the Vatican.

James A. Singer, Planned Parenthood Association lawyer, said Missouri laws permitted operation of the clinic. He said six Missouri counties maintained birth control clinics.

The advisory committee is not expected to reach a decision until September.
