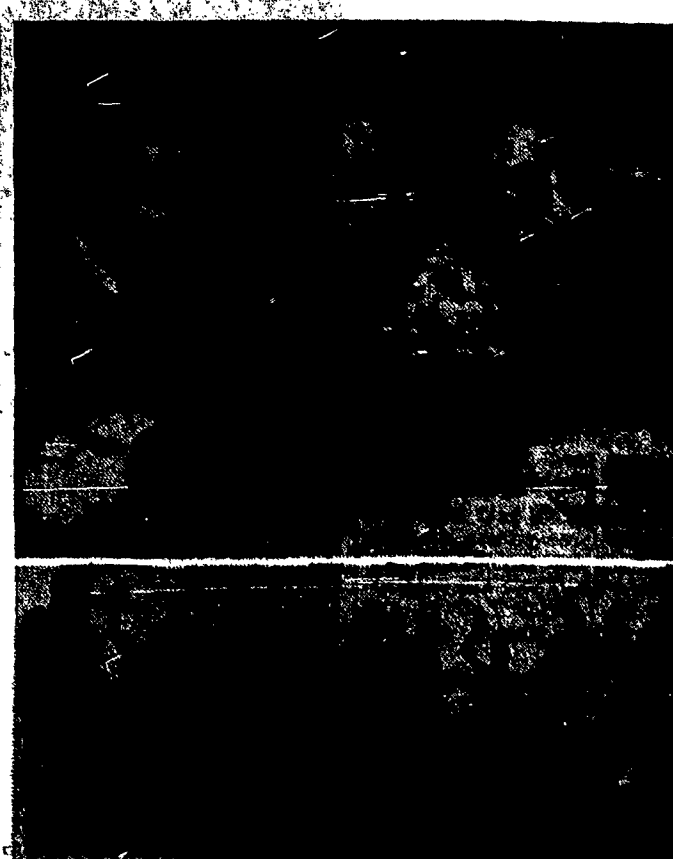

Chinese Band Led By Priest

Iping, Szechwan, China—NC
—When the municipal band plays in the weekly concerts in this west-China city, the musicians keep their eyes on the baton of a missionary priest. He is the Rev. Georges Montillon, of the Paris Foreign Missions, who conducts the town band with verve and skill. The concerts are held every Saturday. The large park is packed, while an overflow crowd fills "balcony seats" in the branches of the trees and the windows of adjoining houses. An 80-voice choir from the Catholic school here is also present in these concerts.

London Prelate Hits Barbarism of Soviets

London (NC)—His Eminence Bernard Cardinal Griffin, Archbishop of Westminster, in an address here, charged that Russians today are perpetrating "exactly the same barbarities" as the nazis. "I think it is because we have not shown a firm hand, either ourselves or America, that we find ourselves in the present position," the Cardinal said, adding that the position of the western powers in Berlin and in many parts of eastern Europe has come about through complete neglect of principles of the Atlantic Charter and the late President Roosevelt's four freedoms. "ALMOST FROM the moment that the Atlantic Charter was signed by the Soviet Government and its satellites," he continued, "those governments have not ceased to break it. It was in the name of freedom that the nazis committed their atrocities. I suggest that it is in the same name of freedom-loving democracies that the Russians are performing exactly the same barbarities. I presume it is in the name of freedom that the Soviet has taken over one country after another."

Cardinal Griffin suggested that it was also in the name of democracy that the Soviet Government organized so-called free elections and that concentration camps are still full wherever Communists are.

"It is the attitude of the Soviet Government which has made our task in Germany so difficult," Cardinal Griffin said, adding that he remembered seeing in Poland Russian trains going through filled with food, loot and machinery taken from the Russian occupation zone.

"It is because the Soviet realizes that starvation of people is going to help their plans for world revolution that they do this," he declared, suggesting that this age would be called the "age of martyrdom."

Eastern European Christians are faced with serious problems and are looking to Britain and America to take the lead in maintaining those principles for which they stand, he declared.

"If we take a firm stand in every case where there is a breach of those principles of which I have been speaking and are prepared to take real action we shall justify the high admiration in which we are held in the world."

Trailer Chapel Takes Faith To Adirondack Mts.

Lake George, N. Y.—NC
—Paulist Fathers, veterans of 15 years experience of conducting missions among non-Catholics in the South and West, have invaded this area of Adirondack Mountains summer vacationists with mission chapels.

The missions are headed by the Rev. Ralph Carpenter, C.S.P. long experienced in missions in Tennessee. He is being assisted here by the Rev. Mons. Thomas Marley and Robert Scott, seminarians of the Paulist Seminary in Washington, D. C.

Father Carpenter has reported that audiences of 500 persons at a time have forsaken the vacation pleasures to attend services at the chapel-trailer. The program consists of talks on the Catholic Faith, question periods and a motion picture on the life of Christ. Father Carpenter has reported that questions from Protestants and Jews have been numerous during the question period. Besides the Lake George region, it was announced, Paulist Fathers will conduct missions in Warrensburg, Bolton Landing, North Creek, Glens Falls, and Chestertown, N. Y.

Bishop O'Hara Still At Post in Bucharest

Bucharest (RNS)—Bishop Gerald F. O'Hara, of Savannah, Atlanta, Ga., who is serving as regent of the Apostolic Nunciature here, has not left Bucharest as rumored. He has not curtailed his activities since the announcement of the concordat with the Vatican, and continues his task of assisting needy Catholics.

Bishop O'Hara was appointed regent in January, 1947, by Pope Pius XII. In Bucharest he took over the duties of Papal Nuncio Archbishop Andrea Casali, who was forced to withdraw for reasons of ill health.

New Priest's Chalice Taken At Eire Border

London (NC)—Questions in the Northern Ireland and British Houses of Commons are expected to follow the seizure by British customs officials of a consecrated chalice and a pyx case on the Northern Ireland border with Eire.

They are the property of a newly ordained priest returning to his County Antrim home after ordination in Eire. He had celebrated his first Mass in Dublin where he was presented with the chalice and was travelling home by rail when the chalice and case were seized.

The priest's bags also were searched and he was taken from the train and had to travel on to Belfast by the next one.
