

Group Asks More Interest In Scouting for Catholics

Wider interest of Catholic parishes in the promotion of Catholic Scouting will be sought under plans announced this week by Louis A. Langie, chairman of the Rochester Diocesan Lay Committee on Scouting.

"It is our conviction that scouting under Catholic auspices is a combination of spiritual, recreational and educational programs for youth that, properly directed, can have a telling effect in the formation and development of sound Catholic Americans," the committee asserted.

POINTING OUT that expansion of Catholic Scouting "fulfills the express wishes of His Excellency, Bishop Kearney," the committee announcement stated that a booklet, "Scouting for Catholics—Adding the Supernatural," is being sent to all pastors whose parishes do not have Scout troops. Published by the National Catholic Committee on Scouting, it details scouting activities under Catholic auspices.

The Rev. Walter A. Fischer, diocesan director of youth activities, is chaplain of the Diocesan Lay Committee. Harold J. Coleman is vice-chairman. Other members include David Brady, program chairman; Edward J. Keenan, activities; Fred Weber, secretary; and Martin Q. Moll, public relations.

Mass in Grove Is Highlight Of Ukrainian Seminary Day

Nearly 1,000 persons were present at a Solemn Pontifical Mass in Elser's Grove, Buffalo Road, Sunday morning, Aug. 1, to mark the annual Ukrainian Seminary Day.

The ceremony, unique in the Rochester metropolitan area, was celebrated by the Rev. Dr. V. Lubachivsky. The Most Rev. Ambrose Senushyn, O.S.B.M., of Stamford, Conn., Auxiliary Bishop of the Ukrainian Catholic Diocese, preached the sermon. Deacon of the Mass was the Rev. Jaroslav Gabro, assistant pastor of St. Joseph's Church.

PARISHIONERS of St. Joseph's Church, Rochester, headed by the Rev. Basil Turula, pastor, and Peter Binazek, chairman, sponsored the program. Purpose of the day was to foster vocations to and raise finances for a proposed St. Joseph's Major Seminary building at Catholic University, Washington, D. C.

The seminary came into existence in 1941 when the war made it impossible to attend seminaries in Rome. Innsbruck and Western Ukraine Students of the Washington Institution now are housed in a former seminary of the Salvation Fathers.

Parishioners of St. Peter & Paul Church, Auburn, and St. Nicholas Church, Elmira, only other Ukrainian churches within the Rochester Catholic Diocese also attended the ceremonies.

Selections by local and visiting choirs and other recreational activities were included in the day's program.

Priests To Speak At German Outing

Catholic participation in the resettlement of displaced persons will be emphasized by two priests during the annual German Welfare Day outing Sunday, Aug. 8, at Scheutzen Park.

Principal speaker will be the Rev. Vincent Broanan, assistant director of War Relief Services, National Catholic Welfare Conference. Father Broanan, an ex-U. S. Army chaplain, will be introduced by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. John S. Randall, diocesan director of the Propagation of the Faith and managing editor of the Courier Journal, who also will deliver a brief talk.

Included among affiliates of the Federation of German-American organizations of Rochester, sponsors of the outing, are the Catholic Kolping Society and the Catholic Central Verein. Last year a total of \$1,672 was turned over to the NCWC War Relief Services by the Federation.

Elmira — St. Anthony's annual parish picnic will be held Sunday, Aug. 15, at Harris Hill, from noon to 8 p. m.

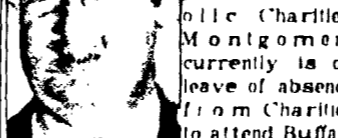

CWV Asks Candidates To Air Stand on Leftist Aid

Asserting that "no sincere American can be a fellow-traveler," a resolution adopted Wednesday night by Monroe County Chapter, Catholic War Veterans, called upon "every candidate for public office" to make known his stand as to the offered support of "those organizations with leftist leanings."

Chapter delegates, meeting in Holy Rosary Clubhouse, adopted the resolution as presented by James A. Ryan, commander of Holy Rosary Post and chairman of the Catholic Action Committee. It stated in part:

Whereas no sensible American on the one hand can condemn the Communists and on the other hand support or condone one who consistently aids and abets the Communist plot; and

Whereas no true "American can be a Communist and no sincere American can be a fellow-traveler of the Communists; and

Whereas the above truths apply to every field of endeavor and in every undertaking in business, in labor, and last but by no means least, in the field of political activities; therefore be it

Resolved: That the Monroe County Chapter of the Catholic War Veterans demand that every candidate for public office, regardless of political affiliation, should make public proclamation of these truths and refuse to be associated with or accept the support of any individual or committee or political party who do not proclaim these truths. And if he fails to do so, he should be rejected by an aroused citizenry.
