Missioners Purchase Washington Estate

Arlington, Va. (NC) — The historic 127-acre Woodlawn, which George Washington gave to his granddaughter, Nellie Custis, as a wedding present, has been purchased by the Immaculate Heart of Mary missionaries, they disclosed at their U. S. headquarters here. The purchase of the estate, near Mount Vernon, was \$165,000. The sale is subject to approval by the Fairfax County Circuit Court.

The estate has a 20-room mansion built by Miss Custis in 1804 and remodeled by the late Senator Oscar Underwood of Alabama in 1925. The site is expected to become the new headquarters of Immaculate Heart of Mary Fathers in the United States, while their present headquarters will be used as a mission procuratorship and for promotion work.

Red Judges Give Priest Four Years

London—(NC)—A military tribunal in Katowice has sentenced the Rev. Michael Norek to four years in prison on charges of opposition to communism and incitement against the present Polish regime, according to the Inter-Catholic Press Agency here.

Father Norek is a repatriate from eastern Poland, which has been incorporated into Soviet territory. He has been pastor in the village of Krzywizna, Lower Silesia.

The priest's mother and brother died in Siberia. At his trial he admitted that having suffered many personal injuries at the hands of the Russians he lacked sympathy with Russia. As a Catholic priest, he said, he could not approve atheistic communism. Charged with having organized prayers for Poles who died during exile in Siberia, he

Says Moslems Against Marxism

New York — (NC) — Moslem leaders are among the strongest opponents of Communism in Indonesia, Archbishop Georges de Jonghe d'Ardoye, first Apostolic Delegate to Indonesia, declared in an interview here.

As believers in God, Moslems are opposed to any movement which denies His existence, Archbishop d'Ardoye said. The Catholic Church is flourishing in Indonesia, he said, praising the kindness and cooperation of Dutch and Indonesian officials.

ARCHBISHOP D'ARDOYE, who was born in Belgium and is on his first visit to this country, said he came here at the invitation of His Eminence Francis Cardinal Spellman, Archbishop of New York, who was his guest last May in Batavia, Java, where he resides. He came by air via Belgium and expects to remain in this country about six weeks.

During his stay here, he said, he hoped to arouse interest in founding a Catholic university in Indonesia, where there are 750,000 Catholics. The territory covered by his delegation extends from Sumatra to New Guinea. Archbishop d'Ardoye, who speaks English fluently, was appointed first Apostolic Delegate to Indonesia in July, 1947. He had previously served as Apostolic Delegate to Iraq.

Mass for Guam Hero—Priest Agana, Guam—NC—Catholics from villages throughout Guam journeyed in pilgrimage to the tomb of the Rev. Jesus Duenas at Insjaran. A Solemn Memorial Mass was offered there for the man who was beheaded in 1945 by the Japanese just before they were driven from the island.
