great, who has signed with the
Seattle Club of the Detroit Tig-
gers, will enter Notre Dame Uni-
versity in the fall where he will
remain until time to report in
the spring.

Son of Mr. and Mrs. Albert
Falk, 65 Valley Road, Brighton,
Tommy has not fully decided on
his course at Notre Dame but
may major in Physical Educa-
tion.

He is now working out with
the Montpelier Club in the North-
ern League, where he will re-
main until time to enter Notre
Dame. In February he will re-
port to the Seattle Club, Tigers
farm team, for spring training.

Tommy, a first baseman, was
playing with the Brockport Bar-
ons in the District Semipro
League prior to leaving for
Montpelier. He also played with
the Cooper Marine Legion Team.

He played right end on the
Aquinas football team and guard
on the basketball team for three
seasons at the Catholic boys'
high school and stood out in his
performances.

Signed by Tiger Scout Edwin
J. (Cy) Williams, to a three-year
contract, Williams declared he
