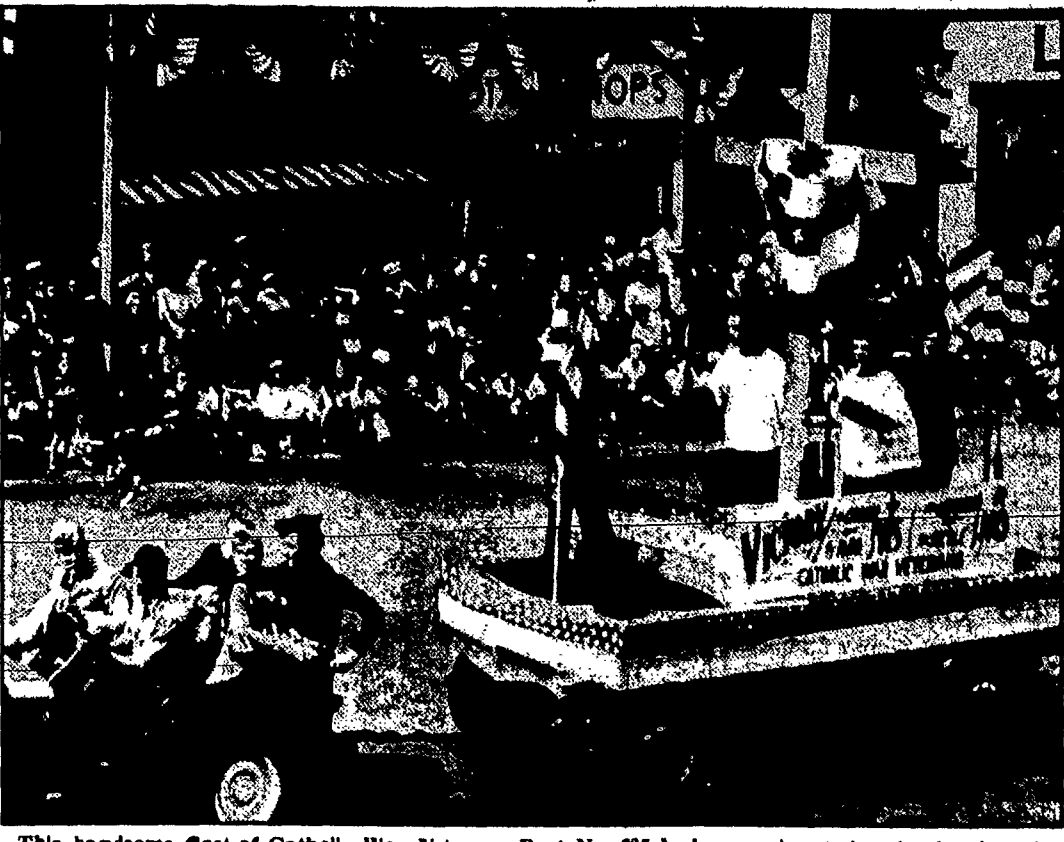

### Fr. Vogt at Youth Stamp Ceremony at White House

The Rev. Joseph E. Vogt, chaplain at the New York State Industrial School at Industry, headed for the White House in Washington this week to participate in ceremonies inaugurating a new commemorative stamp to be known as the "Salute to Youth."

### Rev. Joseph E. Vogt

Father Vogt, widely known for his work with children and young people, was invited because of his recognized leadership in the field of delinquency. The ceremonies were scheduled Thursday.

Two years ago Father Vogt attended the National Conference on Delinquency in Washington on invitation of Attorney General Thomas Clark. He aided in formulating recommendations adopted by the Conference relative to the prevention of delinquency and the care of delinquents.

AFTER THE conference he received a letter of thanks from J. Edgar Hoover, director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, for the assistance he gave to the FBI agent studying the field of delinquency.

Ordained in 1931, Father Vogt first served as assistant pastor of St. Boniface Church. He joined the staff of Rochester Catholic Charities in 1937. As director of its Social Action Department he supervised the Charles Settlement House, Genesee Institute, Columbus Youth Association and Camp Stella Maris. He also served as Diocesan Chaplain of Catholic Scout troops.

Father Vogt has been chaplain at Industry since 1944. He has two brothers also priests of Rochester Diocese—the Rev. George C. Vogt, pastor of Church of the Good Shepherd, Henrietta, and St. Joseph's Church, Rush, and the Rev. Francis H. Vogt, assistant pastor of St. Francis of Assisi Church, Rochester.
