### Kalb Head Of Branch Bank

Robert H. Kalb, newly appointed manager of the new Ridge-Dewey Office of Lincoln Rochester Trust Company, which opened for business Tuesday morning, August 24, at 535 Ridge Road, is a former Rochesterian who attended St. Boniface School and Rochester Cathedral High School before entering the banking business over 21 years ago.

For 13 years, from 1934 to 1947 Kalb was a member of the Newark office of Lincoln Rochester Trust Company. He is a past vice president of the Blessed Sacrament Holy Name Society and Past Grand Knight of Newark Council, Knights of Columbus.

Kalb joined the Lincoln Alliance Bank on January 2, 1927 as main office bookkeeper and in 1928 transferred to the bank's Monroe Avenue Office. He was made assistant manager of Newark Office on April 1, 1936. He returned to Rochester in May 1947 as assistant branch supervisor.

The newly constructed office of which he has been named manager, is Rochester's newest financial structure, built of straw colored brick with limestone entrance and trim. All metal work, window assemblies and hardware are of aluminum. The lobby is floored in Tennessee marble with side walls of bleached oak.

Features of the new office include a Safe Deposit Vault on ground floor, a separate entrance opening off the adjoining parking area, and a complete Drive-In Teller's Window which enables customers to transact their banking business without leaving their cars. The basement of the new building provides a kitchen and dining room for employees as well as storage and locker rooms.

Kalb is manager of Lincoln Rochester Trust Company's seventeenth office, the others being located in Rochester, Irondequoit, Brighton, Greece, Brockport, Canandaigua, Corning, Geneva and Newark.
