Father Sullivan Flies From Rome For Kin's Rites

Funeral services for Edward F. Sullivan, brother of the Rev. Joseph J. Sullivan who was killed Wednesday, Aug. 25, 1948, near Syracuse were conducted Saturday Aug. 28, from his home, 79 Kron St., and at St. Monica's Church.

Solemn Requiem Mass was offered by Father Sullivan who flew from Rome where he is stationed as Vatican correspondent for the National Catholic Welfare Conference News Service. Assisting were the Rev. George T. McCall, deacon, and the Rev. Patrick J. Flynn, sub-deacon.

A clerk at the main postoffice in Rochester, Sullivan died of injuries received when his car hit a pole and rolled over after he failed to negotiate a curve driving west on Camillus Hill outside Syracuse. He was the son of the late John J. Sullivan, former assistant postmaster.

A graduate of Aquinas Institute where he played football for four years, Sullivan served in the U. S. Air Force from March, 1941 to December, 1943.

SURVIVING BESIDES Father Sullivan are his mother, Mrs. Harriet H. Sullivan; a sister, Mary Margaret Sullivan; four other brothers, George T. and Leo A. Sullivan of Rochester; Bernard P. Sullivan of Washington, D. C. and John B. Sullivan of Tulsa, Okla.; several nieces and nephews.

Canandaigua Veterans' Chaplain Returns To Army

Rev. Vincent A. Beyma, for the past two and one half years Catholic Chaplain at the Veterans Administration Hospital, Canandaigua, will terminate his duties on September 6, to return to active duty with the Chaplain Corps of the United States Army.

Shortly after the formation of the Veterans Administration Chaplain Corps Father Beyma was assigned to Canandaigua in February, 1946, as the first full-time Chaplain ever assigned to that hospital. A regular schedule of daily and Sunday Masses was established in October, 1946. His Excellency Bishop Kearney of Rochester blessed a temporary chapel which has been used for daily Masses.

Father Beyma will leave before 1932 in the Scranton Diocese, and was serving as pastor of St. Joseph's Church, South Pittston, Pa. in 1942, when he left to accept a commission as an Army Chaplain.

During the war Chaplain Beyma spent 30 months overseas in the European theater with the Third Armored Division. He has received orders to report to Fort Lewis, Washington, for his new assignment with the Sixth Army.

Father Beyma will leave behind him many friends in Canandaigua, including hundreds of patients in the Veterans Administration Hospital who have learned to be guided by his counsel, and a number of friends in Rochester where his father, Andrew Beyma, resides at 87 Richmond Street.

New Auditorium Student Center For Niagara U.

Niagara University, N. Y.—The Scruffari Construction Company of Niagara Falls has been awarded the contract for construction of Niagara University's new auditorium and student center. It was announced today by university authorities.

Ground will be broken for the new structure the latter part of this week and according to specifications will be ready for occupancy within nine months. When completed, the projected building will solve one of the university's major problems in the wake of heavy postwar registrations and will provide more space for expanding collegiate activities and athletics.

The structure, 248 feet in length and 182 feet in width, will house a cafeteria, locker rooms, a reception room and several small group rooms on the ground floor, while the main floor in addition to the space used for an auditorium and gymnasium, will accommodate three athletic offices, team dressing rooms, and a lounge.
