Father Sullivan Flies From Rome For Kin's Rites

Funeral services for Edward F. Sullivan, brother of the Rev. Joseph J. Sullivan who was killed Wednesday, Aug. 25, 1948, near Syracuse were conducted Saturday Aug. 28, from his home, 79 Kron St., and at St. Monica's Church.

Solemn Requiem Mass was offered by Father Sullivan, who flew from Rome where he is stationed as a Vatican correspondent for the National Catholic Welfare Conference News Service.

A clerk at the main postoffice in Rochester, Sullivan died of injuries received when his car hit a pole and rolled over after he failed to negotiate a curve driving west on Carnhill Hill out side Syracuse. He was the son of the late John J. Sullivan, former assistant postmaster.

A graduate of Aquinas Institute where he played football for four years, Sullivan served in the U. S. Air Force from March, 1941 to December, 1943.
