Parish School In 92nd Year

"The Sisters of Charity have lately begun an Orphanage Academy and Free School at St. Peter & Paul's in Elmira." Thus read an item in the "Buffalo Catholic Sentinel" on Sept. 24, 1857. This week — more than nine decades later — the Rev. William J. Naughton, pastor, announced the 92nd opening of the parish school. In making the announcement he declared: "For nearly a century our parish church has espoused the cause of Catholic education in this city. Hundreds of gradu- ates in that time have been trained to take their places in various activities of life, pre- pared not only to be good citi- zens, but what is more essen- tial, good Catholics."

Marge Porzelt, a member of Immaculate Conception parish, will be the featured vocalist on the musical program which runs from 9 to midnight. Thirty young people from a number of different city high schools will handle all the ar- rangements for these weekly Fri- day night dances. The priests of the parish and ten adults supervise the affairs. One of the first dry night clubs in the city, Immaculate has catered to overflowing crowds during the eight years it has been open. The Rochester Transit Corporation furnishes extra buses for the youthful dancers. The committee is completing plans for a modern "Barn Dance" to be held Wednesday, Sept. 15. Nolan's 15 pieces will handle the smooth and lumpy rhythms and Bill Donadoni will furnish music for square sets. John E. Drew is general chair- man for the dances. Admission is sixty cents per person.
