## Pilgrimage To Scotland Made by Area Guildsmen

Led by 79-year-old Mrs. Catherine Kane, a group of Rochesterians took part in Scotland's national pilgrimage to the shrine of St. Margaret of Scotland at Dunfermline, just north of the Firth of Forth above Edinburgh.

The Rochester contingent, with about six hundred other Gaelic-Americans, was given the place of honor in the pilgrimage to the tomb of Scotland's patroness at Dunfermline Abbey.

Mrs. Kane, who was born at Coatsbridge, Lanarkshire, Scotland, was the oldest pilgrim to make the trip. Heading the American delegation many of whom were of Scot-



ish birth or extraction, was the Rev. Colman Gallagher, S.A., a Scottish-born Franciscan Friar of the Atonement from Graymoor, Garrison, N. Y. Father Colman is well-known in Rochester, having made several visits here.

Other members of the Rochester group, all of whom are members of the St. Margaret of Scotland Guild, were President and Mrs. James McCabe, Miss Wipfried McCabe, Mrs. William Tracy, Mr. and Mrs. Martin Kenney, Miss Mary Ellen Kane, Mr. and Mrs. J. Timmons, and Mrs. M. Timmons.

The Rochesterians embarked August 11 on the SS Washington, arriving at the landing at Southampton nearly 500 miles to the south of Dunfermline. Before leaving, the American pilgrims presented an inscribed plaque to the town of Dunfermline, and Father Colman, in an address, promised: "In 1950 instead of a few hundred pilgrims, we will bring several thousand."

AMERICAN NAVAL personnel from the U.S.S. Hamul, a naval repair ship stationed at nearby Rosyth, formed a guard of honor, and Father Colman, accompanied by the Rev. Stephen G. Horvath, U. S. Navy chaplain, headed the public procession of 8,000 to St. Margaret's Memorial Church. The American pilgrims carried banners of the queen-saint and signs bearing the names of the towns and cities from which they had come.

The pilgrims from overseas were admitted to the small church; the thousands of others

followed the service through loud-speakers. Later they knelt to receive Benediction given by Father Colman from the church steps.

Many pilgrims kept all-night vigil before the Blessed Sacrament in St. Margaret's Church on the night before the final ceremony. They also visited the queen-saint's own chapel in nearby Edinburgh Castle.

ST. MARGARET was a queen and the wife of King Malcolm III, who reigned during the latter part of the eleventh century in Scotland. She died in Edinburgh Castle at the age of 46 in 1093. Her feast day is June 10.

The St. Margaret of Scotland Guild was formed in America by Father Colman to preserve the religious, social and cultural traditions of their native countries in the Scotch and Irish immigrants in this country. Rochester Branch was formed several years ago.

## Priest Lists Items Needed For Europe Aid

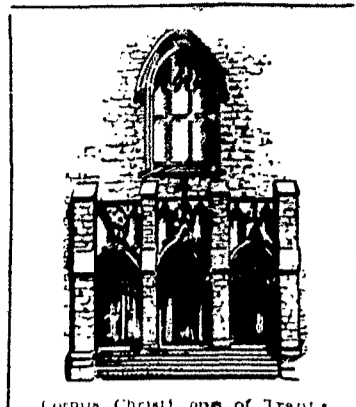
Necessity of prayer for and continued interest in the plight of starving Europe was stressed this week by the Rev. John T. Callahan, chaplain of Our Lady of Mercy High School.

"The need continues great," Father Callahan stated. Reminding that many Catholic parishes and schools are conducting regular continuing campaigns for relief articles, Father Callahan urged Catholics to call the schools if they have any donations of articles or money for postage. Addresses of needy Europeans also will be supplied, he added. He listed the following principal needs:

- To Keep Them Alive - fat, flour, sugar.
- To Keep Them Clean and Neat - 2 sheets, pillow cases, 2 turkish towels, 2 dish towels, tooth brush, soap, shaving cream, pins, needles, black and white thread, thimble, hooks, buttons, safety pins, pencils.
- To Keep Them Warm - woolen undershirt, union suit, woolen stockings and socks, cap and shawl, woolen gloves or mittens, flannel nightshirt, blankets, warm slippers, Oxford or sport shoes, knitting wool for pullover sweaters plus knitting needles.
- To Make Them Happy - coffee, tea, cocoa, chocolate, spam, sardines, rice, powdered egg, dehydrated or condensed milk, nuts, dried fruit, hard candies, cigarettes.

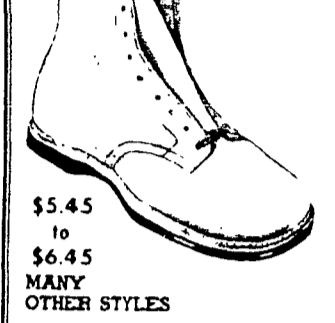

## CWV Asks State To Deny Jobs To Reds

A petition to enact legislation which would bar Communists and Communist sympathizers from employment by the State of New York and by any municipality within the State was presented Tuesday night by Monroe County Chapter, Catholic War Veterans.

The meeting was held in Holy Redeemer hall. The resolution was presented by Raymond W. Zink, Vice Commander of Monroe County Chapter and was unanimously adopted because "the members consider the purposes of the Communist Party with its various fronts in the United States as opposed to and dangerous to our form of government and the American way of life."

The Chapter also decided to follow up on a previous demand that all candidates make known their stand on Communism. A letter is to be sent to candidates asking them to declare their stand on the offered support of those groups with leftist leanings.

## Firemen To Sell Show Tickets

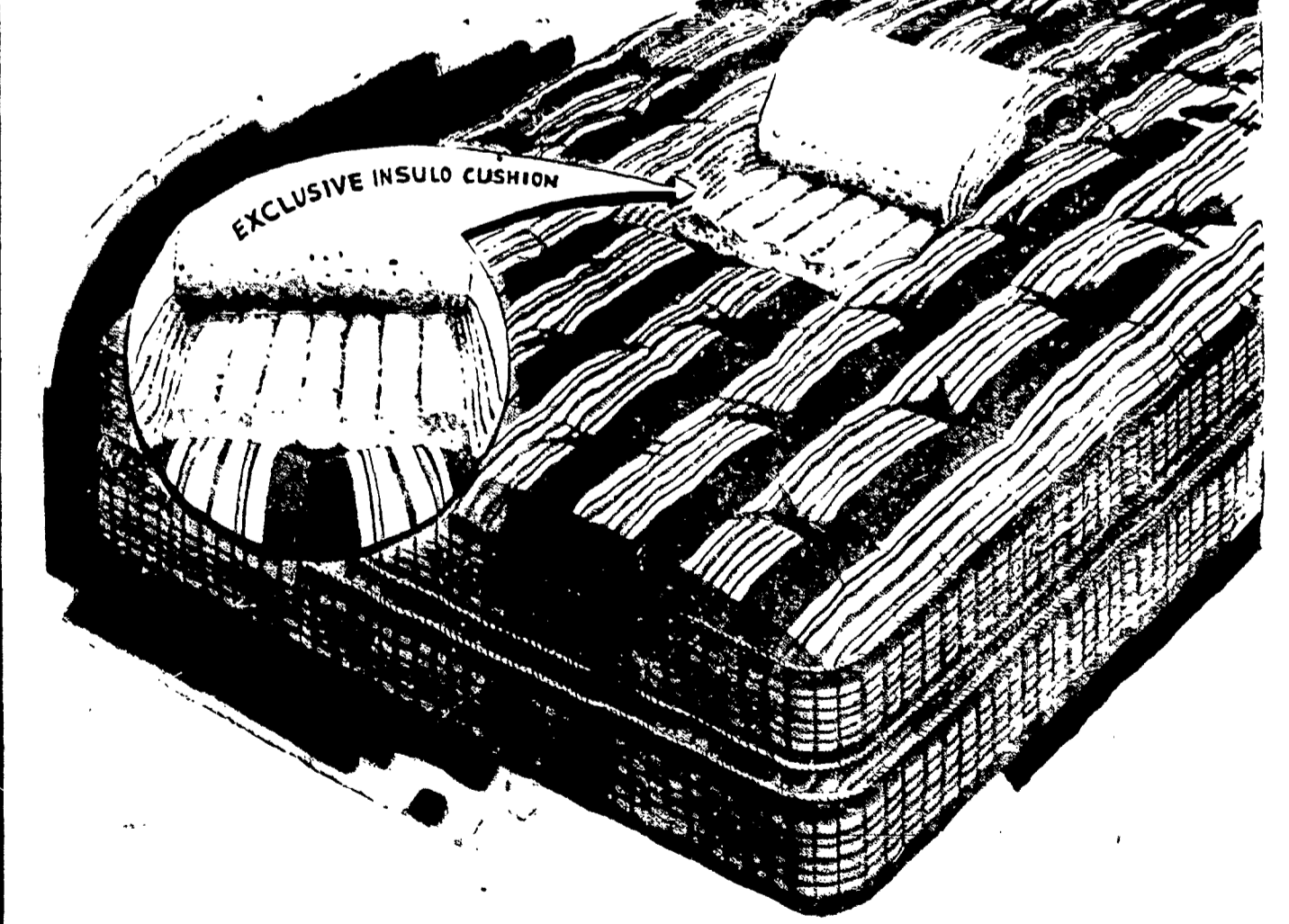
