

### Belgians Send Aid To Nazareth Refugees

Cairo — (NC) — A Belgian priest, representing Bishop Louis J. Kerkhofs of Liege, has arrived here with a relief fund of one million Belgian francs to be used for the aid of Palestine Arab refugees. The priest, Father Naueu, after an earlier visit to the Near East, had reported to Bishop Kerkhofs on the dire plight of thousands of refugees in and outside Palestine who are crowded in cities and threatened with famine and epidemics. The bishop appealed to Belgian Catholics and a collection was taken up to "adopt" Nazareth home of Christ prior to his public life, where the refugee situation is at present particularly acute.

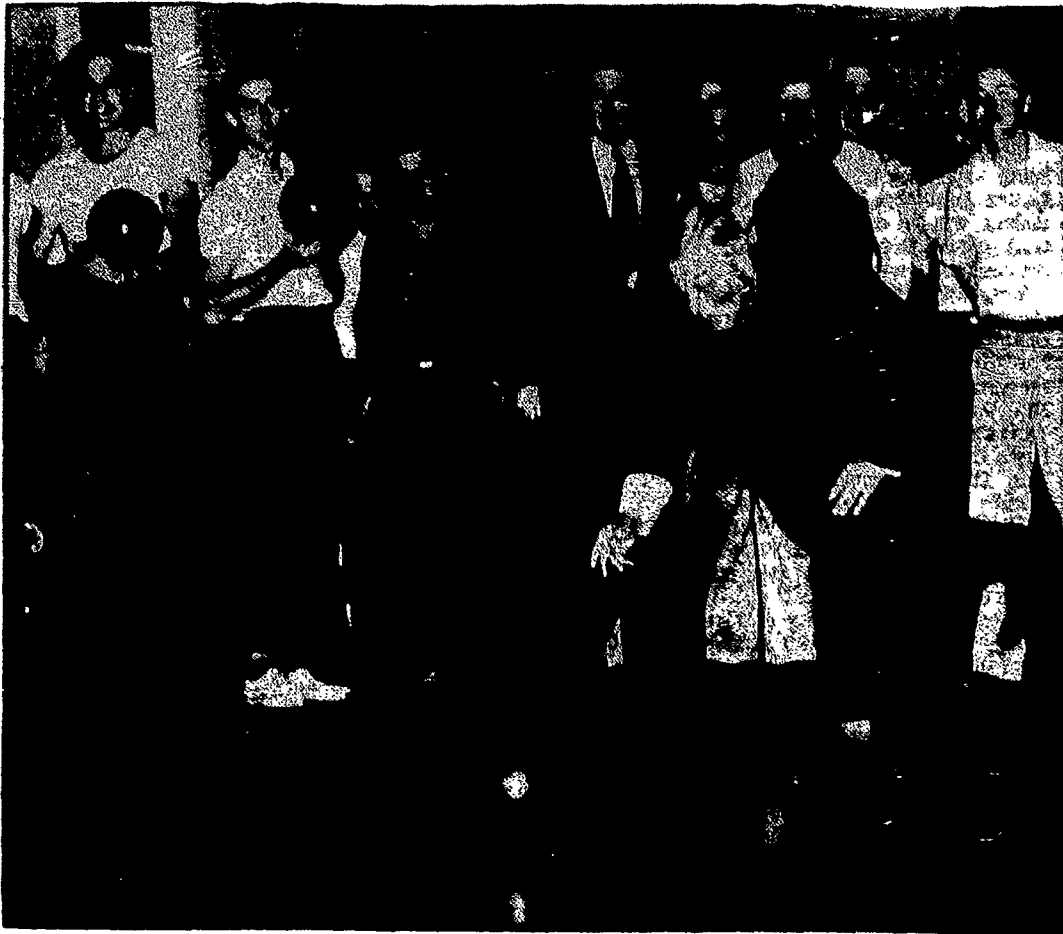

Principal difficulty, it was pointed out by Arthur P. Farren, Holy Name executive secretary, will be the obtaining of suitable courts for practice and league courts; others may be able to obtain the use of nearby city-owned or private-owned buildings.

Sponsoring the league will be the Rochester Deaneary Holy Name Union headed by Edward M. Lorscheider, president. It will be conducted similarly to the Holy Name-sponsored Parochial School Softball League, in which 24 parishes participated. Holy Name Societies will be asked to underwrite the nominal costs involved in entry of their boys.

Three parishes already have signified their intention to participate, Farren said.
