**'OLIVER TWIST' MOVIE FOUGHT BY NY RABBIS**

New York — (RNS) — Describe the British-made film "Oliver Twist" as a "vehicle of blatant anti-Semitism," the New York Board of Rabbis has urged Eric Johnston, president of the Motion Picture Producers Association of America to keep the movie out of the U. S.

In a cable to Johnston, who is now in Europe, the Board made specific objection to the characterization of a Jew named "Fagin" who appears both in the film and in the Charles Dickens novel on which the movie is based.

The rabbis said "the villainous Fagin as a central figure is a horrid stereotype certain to stir up in the public mind hatred and prejudices."

"The showing of this film in one American theater," they said, "will undo all the splendid work of such American films as 'Gentlemen's Agreement,' 'Crossfire' and others. We respectfully urge that you do everything possible to keep 'Oliver Twist' and its patent prejudices out of this country."

**Virtue Among Slaves in 'Greatest Story' on WARC**

"Men with the Mark," a gripping drama of five galley slaves in the days when the Roman Empire reigned supreme, will be broadcast on the Greatest Story Ever Told, Sunday at 6:30 p. m. over WARC (950 kc.).

The plot involves a galley slave who wins freedom and returns to his former position of power and influence, promising to give refuge to any men with "the mark." "The mark" refers to the scars left by the chain and the lash on men who have labored for years at pulling the oars for the Roman galleys. Suspense is built up as the former galley slave encounters each victim who comes to him.

Designed to bring out the truth of Christ's teachings, the story follows the theme "for with the same measure that you mete, it shall be measured to you again" ... Luke 6:38.

A SERIES of talks on Christ and the saints will be presented on the Sacred Heart Program, a WFRY (680 kc.) feature, which is heard at 12:15 p. m. each day except Sunday.

One of the most highly rated features in radio circles, the Sacred Heart program combines familiar prayers and hymns with inspirational and informative talks. New York — (NC) — An album of special recordings has been synchronized and added to the film strip, "The Story of Fatima," produced under the direction of the Rev. Joseph Cella of the St. Anthony's Welfare Center, here. It has been announced. The records provide background music, played by John J. Ward, prominent organist and narrator by Msgr. Thomas J. McMahon, executive secretary of the Catholic Near East Welfare Association.

The film strip and record were produced for the benefit of devotional groups, schools, study clubs and similar organizations.

**U. S. Scholars Edit Genesis In New Text**

Washington — (NC) — A new version of the Book of Genesis has been published, and with it the Old Testament has begun to unfold through the scholarship of American Catholics.

The volume is the fruit of a project begun in 1938 by the Catholic Biblical Association of America under the sponsorship of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine. It is a companion to the revision of the New Testament known as the "Confraternity Edition," which has sold more than a million copies since its appearance in 1941.

The Rev. Edward A. Mangan, C.S.S.R., of Immaculate Conception Seminary, Oconomowoc, Wis., made the translation, and submitted it to a Biblical Association editorial board.

The book, which tells the story of the beginning of mankind and of the Jewish people from Adam to the death of Joseph, contains 123 pages of annotated text. Publisher is the St. Anthony Guild Press of Paterson, N. J.

THE BOOK OF PSALMS is the next scheduled for release in the series, and the work of translating and editing has also been completed on the Books of Exodus, Leviticus, and Osee. In all, 40 of the 46 Old Testament books have been translated by the Catholic Biblical Association scholars.

Unlike the Confraternity edition of the New Testament, the new version of Genesis goes to the original Scriptural language rather than to the Latin Vulgate. This follows from the recommendations made by His Holiness Pope Pius XII in September, 1943, in his encyclical "Divino Afflante Spiritu."

**Movie Congress Honors 'Fugitive'**

Rome — (RNS) — John Ford's production "The Fugitive," starring Henry Fonda, was named the best movie of the year by the International Catholic Film Congress at its annual meeting in Venice.

The film tells the story of a priest pursued and eventually martyred during a period of religious persecution in an unnamed country.

A proposal submitted by John Burke, British delegate, urged an international prayer crusade for the "spiritual progress" of the film industries in various countries.

A special report was read describing the work of the Legion of Decency, American Catholic organization which reviews and classifies motion pictures according to their moral ratings.

**British Bishops in Movie**

London — (NC) — Two British Bishops will star in a 40-minute documentary film in color, "The Sacrifice We Offer," now being produced in this country by Alan Turner, Catholic industrialist of Derby, who won international praise for his first Catholic documentary, "Family Affair."

**Proposed Stamp Will Honor Msgr. Flanagan**

Lincoln, Neb. — (RNS) — A proposed stamp honoring the late Msgr. Edward J. Flanagan, founder of Boys Town, Neb., has been cleared by the U. S. Post Office for consideration in 1949.

It was announced here by Senator Kenneth Wherry of Nebraska, who introduced a bill to introduce a stamp.
