liam B. Lipphard, president of the Associated Church Press (Protestant), three candidates for the presidency of the United States have given their views on the appointment of Myron C. Taylor as diplomatic repre-

sentative to the Vaticam. From the White House, Dr. Lipphard was informed by Charles G. Boss, secretary to President Truman, that Taylor's mission "would be terminated when peace is made." Ross said this will "remain the President's policy, and will be strictly adhered to so long as he is in office."

The reply from Gov. Thomas E. Dewey stated that "there are many questions of administrative policy which an incoming Presi-Pres. Truman dent cannot and should not decide until after

he takes office." Henry A. Wallace said he opposed the appointment of a personal ambassador to the Vatican. "It seems to me," he said, "that a country like the United States, which has taken a very special stand with regard to the separation of Church and State, should hardly give this kind of recognition to one Church without
