Snake Bite Rumor At Park Scotched

Canandaigua — A rumor declared utterly false and a contemptible lie by William W. Mear, founder and proprietor of Roseland Park, concerning a snake biting a child has been run down and the origin believed found.

Gossip had it that a small child had been bitten by a rattlesnake while seated in one of the kiddie rides at the park recently. The rumor developed as it was bandied about, and among other wild versions was one that a man had been bitten by the rattlesnake. Later Mear learned from a local doctor that a small boy had been bitten by a water snake at the home of his parents on Canandaigua Lake's west shore, 15 miles south of this city.

According to Mear's information, the boy was standing in the water, helping his father construct a breakwater of large rocks offshore from his father's property, when bitten. Rushed to the doctor's office the boy was found to have been bitten by a non-poisonous snake.

The doctor, who asked that his name be withheld, called the park proprietor to give him the information which Mear believes had been twisted into the false rumor about a snake in Roseland Park.

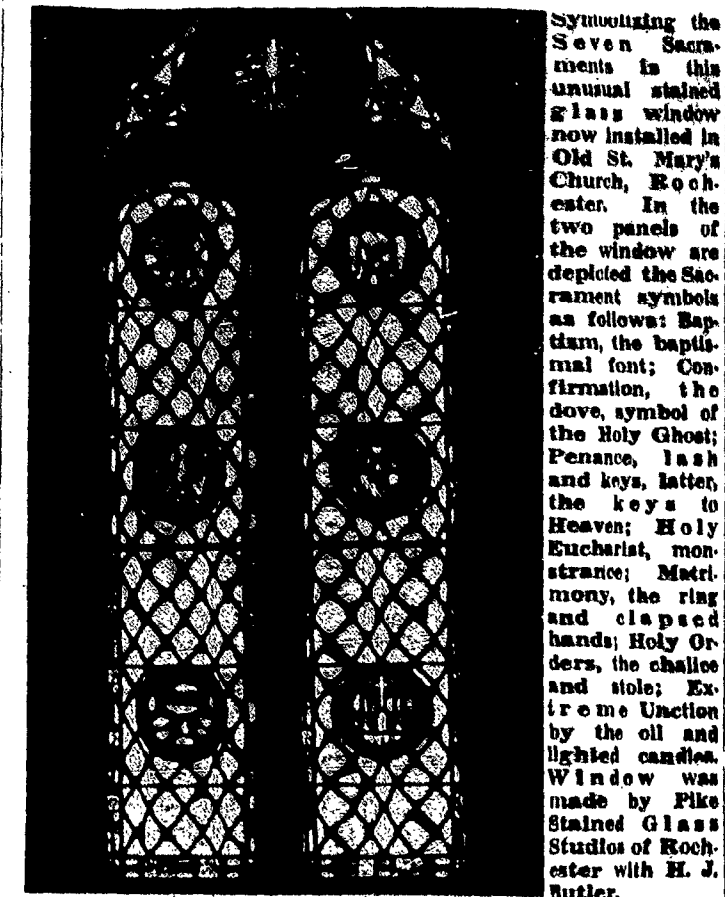
