Students who wished to enter were given the opportunity to take examinations in 11 cities—Peiping, Tientsin, Shanghai, Tainan, Hankow, Tsingtao, Pengpu, Sian, Canton, Swatow and Meishien. The examinations were held in Catholic schools, and for many applicants this was their first contact with Catholicism.
