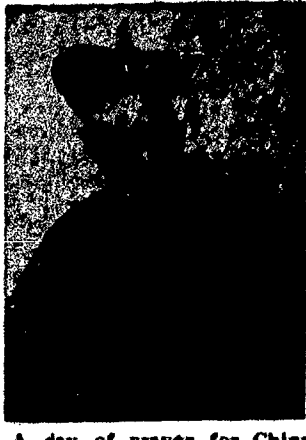


Speaker Named for PTA Meet, Oct. 4

Released Time For 28,000 Pupils

Of New York schools, Father Schnacky declared, "Our parish programs are operating with the approval of the state superintendent of schools whose legal counsel holds that New York State released-time privilege is perfectly legal and may continue. Only two communities in the whole diocese have asked that the religious classes be moved out of the school buildings." Last year's record diocesan total of 27,560 Catholic pupils under released-time instruction included 6,983 pupils in the city of Rochester. Local Board of Education figures disclosed that this Catholic number was 65% of the total city registration. Over 20,000 other city school pupils did not request the optional religion classes from their churches.

On the national scene, following the Supreme Court ruling, newly all states have forbidden religious instruction in public school buildings. Father Schnacky stated, Vermont, Kansas, Michigan and Illinois have completely cancelled all instruction program. New York, California, Virginia, Pennsylvania and others still permit public school children to use school hours for instruction off school property.

Sodality Rally Aides Named

The Steering Committee for the forthcoming Congress of Mary planned for Nov. 11-12 at Aquinas Institute, Rochester, under sponsorship of all diocesan sodality organizations, has scheduled a meeting for Monday at Corpus Christi Hall to discuss the entertainment program for the affair. Rev. Roy Morphy, general chairman of the Congress, has selected Rev. Charles Bauer of Holy Family parish to head the entertainment committee. According to Father Bauer, "Social activities will play an important part in bringing the delegates together and creating a relaxing atmosphere for the conference." Bernice Terhaar, president of the Diocesan Parish Sodality Union, and John Wolf of St. Boniface parish will aid Father Bauer. The Congress of Mary to be held at Aquinas Nov. 11 and 12 will attract Sodality members from the entire diocese for the meetings. Moderators and student chairmen of local Sodality units constitute the Steering Committee which has been formulating the two-day program.
