## Rumania Reduces Catholic Dioceses

Washington - (NC) - Translating into action a decree that all ecclesiastical dioceses must have a definite number of faithful, arbitrarily set at 750,000, the Rumanian government has published an order authorizing only four Catholic dioceses in the whole country, according to a Vatican Radio broadcast heard here. Rumania formerly had 10 Catholic dioceses - five of the | Latin and five of the Byzantine

THE DECREE invoked by the communist authorities to limit the number of Catholic dioceses and that of other religious denominations was part of a list of statutes issued by the Ministry of Religious Affairs during the early part of August, according to the Vatican broadcast.

The statutes require church bodies to obtain the permission of the Minister of Religious Affairs before holding a general congress or assembly and require approval of local authorities for all religious conferences or meetings, the Vatican Radio said.

They demand that relations with religious bodies outside the country be only of a religious character and that no Church group or representative may conduct relations with foreign ecclesiastical groups, institutions or officials except with the approbation of the Minister of Religious Affairs and through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the broadcast stated.

AS A CONSEQUENCE, Rumania's Catholic Hierarchy may not communicate with the Holy See except through the Rumanian Foreign Office, headed by arch communist Ana Pauker.





Others are being moved to Iraq, where it is feared their faith will be endangered because of the lack of priests, and to the vicinity of Jericho and elsewhere, along the Jordan valley. News that American Catholics have donated \$75,000 for the relief of these refugees, has brought some hope to them.
