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Time for Filing Applications In K. C. Scholarship Tests Moved To December

Two major changes in the scholarship program of New York State Council, Knights of Columbus, are announced by Grand Knight John J. Kinney of Rochester Council today.

The scholarship award is now \$400 per year for four years instead of the previous \$200. The sum awarded may be applied in whole or in part to defray the expenses of the holder for tuition, books and maintenance in any college located in the United States conducted under Catholic auspices and with a scholastic standing equivalent of the colleges empowered by the Regents of the University of the State of New York to confer degrees.

Other change is that date for filing applications has been moved up to Dec. 15, 1948 from the customary March date. A general examination will be conducted on Jan. 15, 1949 and open to all eligible applicants. A final examination in April for the five high "finalists" in each Scholarship District, will be held.

Any practicing Catholic boy or girl may make application for the examination, Grand Knight Kinney states.

THE APPLICATION must bear the signature of the candidate, that of his or her parent or guardian, and that of the pastor or assistant pastor of the candidate. Also included with the application must be the certification of some person in authority in the candidate's present school, that the candidate for the scholarship is a candidate for graduation in that school in January, 1949 or June, 1949.

All candidates must submit to a preliminary examination (screening), which will be prepared and scored by Educational Testing Service. No specific courses are required as preparation for this examination, and no candidate who has done acceptable work in high school will be handicapped in answering the questions.

The five candidates in each scholarship district, who score highest in the preliminary examination (finalists), will take a second examination. This latter examination will be given by the College Entrance Examination Board, in April, 1949, to the forty finalists.

THE EXAMINATION will consist of the regular college entrance tests in Scholastic Aptitude (both verbal and mathematical) and in Scholastic Achievement (in English Composition and in American History.) As
