Catholic Pupils' Quiz-Show WHEC Feature, Sat., 10 A.M.

Pupils of two Catholic parochial schools will match wits and brains in WHEC's (1460) "Quiz-down Program" this Saturday at 10 a. m. Schools represented in the junior quiz show will be St. Andrew's and St. Ambrose. The program will be recorded Friday at St. Ambrose auditorium.

The winning school on "Quiz-down" will receive the school edition of the famous Book of Knowledge, a prize worth \$125. A framed Rand-McNally map will be presented to the second-place school.

Questions for this elementary school quiz program which features fourth, fifth and sixth graders, are prepared by children of the same grades.

THE EXCITING story of a missionary's adventures in the frozen north will be dramatized Sunday in the second of a series of radio transcriptions presented by the Society for the Propagation of the Faith in its annual mission appeal.

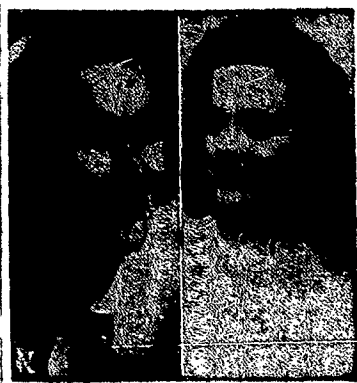

Catholic Films Goal Of New Movie Firm

Hollywood, Cal. — (Special) — Motion pictures adapted from the books, stage plays and original stories of Catholic authors will be produced by a new movie-maker, Veritas Productions, Inc., whose organizational policy is to make "clean, wholesome entertaining movies for appeal to the entire family."

Before scheduling production of any story, Veritas plans to submit the material for the approval of the National Legion of Decency. Aiming at two cultured and entertaining movies a year, the new firm intends to prove that "films which observe proper moral standards can be successful."

The growth of television stations which will use four times as many feature films as the motion picture industry now produces, opens a new field for fine movies, Veritas believes. The new company also cites the growing demand for quality 16 mm. films in schools, church groups, and homes. So far, 25,000 Catholic locations in the U. S. and Canada with movie facilities offer a wide field for wholesome films made from Catholic stories. Authors are invited to submit suitable material.

"**PEACE OF HEART**" will be the subject of an address by the Rev. Edward T. Wiatrak, S.J., speaker on the current Hour of Faith program series. Father Wiatrak, who is associate editor of Jesuit Missionary magazine, will be heard each Sunday during October at 11:30 a. m. on WARC (950).

British "Chain" Spurs Use of Catholic Movies

London — (NC) — The Rev. John Burke, secretary of the British Catholic Film Society, has appealed to Catholic businessmen in larger towns and cities to get together and go into the film business, building up a cinema "chain" to show Catholic and other good films, especially from the Continent.

"There is a growing repertoire of Catholic films of quality which are unable to find a market for lack of picture houses willing to show them," Father Burke said.

Father Burke pointed out that Ireland, with a smaller Catholic population, does see Catholic films because of the Catholic clergy and Catholic management of the film theatres.

He also said that the great French film "Monseigneur Vincent"—a truly religious film dealing with the life of St. Vincent de Paul—would not be seen generally in Britain unless Catholic groups exerted considerable pressure on local managers. Its only British showing is now at an independent house in London's West End.
