Bishop Praises Founders of CDA Unit 25 Years Old

Seneca Falls - Tribute to the charter members of Seneca Falls Court, 824, Catholic Daughters of America, was paid by His Excellency, Bishop Kearney of Rochester at the banquet marking the court's 25th anniversary and held in the Parish hall, Sunday night.

The Bishop compared the women who founded the court in September 1923 to the pioneers who brought the faith to this country.

Bishop Kearney expressed amazement at the report of the amount of charitable work carried on by the Catholic Daughters throughout the country which was made at the recent national convention in Los Angeles.

His Excellency especially commended the women of the Catholic Daughters of New York State for their contributions to seminarians with which to educate priests. He urged the Seneca Falls Catholic Daughters to continue their support of the object.

MORE THAN 150 members of the court as well as guests from courts in Auburn, Geneva, Ovid, Waterloo and Lyons attended. Miss Alice Rogers, a charter member, was toastmistress.

The Rev. John P. O'Brien, pastor of St. Patrick's Church, gave the invocation while other speakers included Miss Marie Curry, Bellrose, L. I., regent of the New York State Catholic Daughters, and Miss Elizabeth Harmon, district deputy of Auburn.

Miss Curry gave a report on the activity of the Courts of the State in regard to contributing to the rehabilitation of European families through CARE. Court Seneca Falls has participated, having sent \$40 per year for each family assisted.

Present also were Rev. Thomas Kane, Rev. John B. Maney, Secretary to Bishop Kearney, and Rev. Father Bernardi, a guest in Seneca Falls from Italy.

Mrs. Camille S. Gentile, grand regent of the Seneca Falls court that has a membership of 230, extended a welcome and on behalf of the court presented corsages to 25 charter members. Special tribute was paid by speakers to the late Mrs. Elizabeth Ryan and to Mrs. Marie Doran who were instrumental in organizing the Seneca Falls Court. Mrs. Ryan was the first grand regent and Mrs. Doran was the first vice regent.

Miss Teresa McGrain, a past Grand Regent, gave a history of the activities of the Court during the past 25 years. Particular tribute was given to the late Mrs. Elizabeth Ryan, first Grand Regent, and to Mrs. Marie Doran, first vice-Grand Regent.

Miss Kathleen Kennedy was soloist and sang two songs. The party closed with group singing, led by Mrs. John Fraser, with Miss Betty McKeever as accompanist. "Daddy, Daddy Sing to Mary" was the closing hymn.
