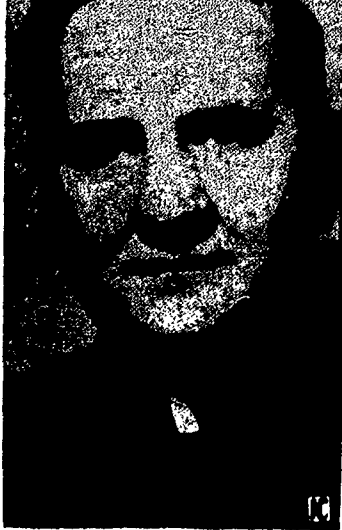
Mask Party Listed By Corning Group

Msgr. Swanstrom Listed For N.C.C.W. Convention

The Rt. Rev. Msgr. Edward E. Swanstrom, executive director of War Relief Services, National Catholic Welfare Conference, will be the guest speaker for the 14th annual convention of the Rochester Diocesan Council, National Council of Catholic Women, set for Wednesday, Oct. 27 at Rochester Chamber of Commerce.

The convention will begin with the offering of Mass by His Excellency, Bishop Kearney in Old St. Mary's Church at 9:30 a. m. Catholic women from the six dioceses, Rochester, Auburn, Elmira, Ithaca, Corning and Geneva, will attend.

All the convention sessions will take place in the Chamber of Commerce, 55 St. Paul Street. Featured on the morning program in addition to the business meetings will be a panel discussion on the convention theme, "The Present Day Status of Women." Rev. Albert J. Shamon, diocesan moderator of the Council will give the keynote speech.

Monsignor Swanstrom's address will be given at the luncheon which begins at 12:15. In the afternoon, the election of board of directors and revision of the Constitution are charted.

RESERVATIONS FOR the luncheon should be in by the deadline Monday, Oct. 25. Mrs. Richard Lee Kalb, diocesan president, is honorary chairman of the convention. Mrs. Leo Muckie, Rochester deanery president, has been named general chairman. The constitution will be in charge of Mrs. Robert Simmons, and exhibits are in the hands of Mrs. Elmer Loritz and Mrs. Frank Shaugnessy. Other chairmen are Miss Marion Warner, handling library and literature, and Mrs. Lawrence Weis, family and parent education.

Mrs. Muckie has extended a general invitation to Catholic women urging them to attend the sessions of the convention, especially the Mass.

(Continued from Page 7) sary, Brigadier General Boyle in his address stated that never in history has moral and spiritual education been so necessary as today, when the world faces fateful decisions that will determine a future of "chaos or regeneration."

The speaker stressed the need for religious education in public schools under an expanded "release time" program.

To exert an influence in expansion of religious education, Boyle called for example "But," he stated, "before we can live our religion we must first understand it. An expanded program of religious education is implied."

A former Board of Education president in Onondaga County, the state leader termed "vicious" the recent attacks made upon the schools' religious education programs, referring to a recent Supreme Court ruling which banned religious instruction within school buildings.

Certain groups, he warned, are now trying to do away with the schools' practice of releasing students during certain periods for religious training.

Guests at the banquet included Gen. Andrew O. Zink of Detroit, Mich., supreme president of the Knights of St. John, Miss Bertha Kinnerknecht of Utica, president of New York Grand Ladies Auxiliary, Knights of St. John, and Father Florack, Lieut. Col. Al G. Miller, past president of St. George Commandery was toastmaster.

John T. Schneider chairman of the anniversary celebration recounted the commandery's history during its 75 years of existence stressing its military record.
