Here's How You May Win!

EXAMPLE: Your last posted average (9 games or more including all games scored 115 or less and including one week of 11, let's say-average 132)... This week you bowl:

1st game	130
2nd game	140
3rd game	155

That's an increase of 20 over your last posted average of 132. To get your percentage of improvement multiply 20 x 100 = 2000 and divide by your old average of 132. Result: 15.15 is your percentage of improvement over your previous posted average. This will be the figure that determines whether or not you win a prize for this particular week.
