

Church Reports Apostates in Austria Return

vounds inflicted through the national-socialist campaign to promote apostasy are slowly healing, much patient labor and sac-rifice will be needed before all the numerical losses which the Church in Austria suffered between 1938 and 1945 have been wiped out.

About 60,000 out of 204.558 who formally apostatized from the Church while Austria was under nazi domination had returned to the fold up to the end of 1947. Figures for the current year are not yet avail-

The return to the faith began slowly while the nazis still dominated Austria and increased with each passing year. In 1938, slightly more than 2,000 apostates appealed for readmission to the Church.

IN 1944, almost 5,000 -- most of them enrolled nazi party members - had the courage to ake the road back to the Church. By the end of the war, about 10 per cent of the total number of apostates had returned to the fold.

> The Church suffered the gravest losses in Vienna, not so much because national socialism had gained a stronger foothold there, but because religious conditions in the city as distinct from those in smaller towns and villages of fered only minor resistance.

Irish Seminary Asks For Funds


Dublin-(RNS)-For the first time since its establishment in 1795, St. Patrick's College at May nooth. County Kildare Ireland's national Roman Catholic seminary - has made a public appeal for funds. The appeal, which

rected to "the Irish people at home and abroad," was author. ized at a meeting of the Irish Hierarchy held at the college under the chairmanship of the Most Rev. John F D'Alton, Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of All Ireland.

Terming St. Patrick's "one of the greatest seminaries in Christendom, which has supplied the vast majority of priests required for the Irish Church and for service to Irish exiles," the Hierarchy declared in a statement "it cannot continue to fulfill this mission without immediate and substantial aid.

The Bishop's statement requested that special collections e taken up in all churches. It pointed out that St. Patrick's is unique in being a university "in double right"—as a Pontifical university by Papal charter, and as a recognized college of the National University of Ireland.
